16	Chair Shulman, we are ready to begin.
17	CHAIRPERSON SCHULMAN: Good morning,
18	everyone. I am Council Member Lynn Schulman, Chair of
19	the New York City Council's Committee on Health.
20	Thank all of you for joining us for today's vote on a
21	Proposed Pre-Considered Resolution sponsored by me,
22	calling on the New York State Legislature to pass and
23	the Governor to sign Assembly Bill 2705 and Senate
24	Bill 4801, relating to the amount of state aid
25	reimbursement for public health services by a

2 municipality in the City of New York when the 3 municipality is providing some or all of certain 4 identified core public health services, otherwise known as Article VI public health funding. The 5 resolution we are voting on today calls for the 6 7 immediate restoration of State Public Health Law Article VI public health funding for New York City. 8 9 In 2019, New York State reduced the reimbursement rate for New York City by 16 percent, from 36 percent 10 11 down to 20 percent, and this cut has yet to be reversed. The loss of funding resulting from the 12 13 reduced reimbursement rate has led directly to a loss 14 of funding for essential on-the-ground community 15 health programs, including family and reproductive 16 health care, communicable disease control, chronic 17 disease prevention, community health assessments, and 18 emergency preparedness. During discussion of my 19 resolution at the Committee's February 19th oversight 20 hearing, the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene 21 testified that New York City loses out on upwards of 2.2 90 million dollars per year in state public health 23 funding due to these cuts. New York City was the only jurisdiction in the state that suffered these cuts, 24 worsening existing inequities in our health system 25

and disproportionately impacting communities of color 2 3 and families with low incomes. Per DOHMH, New York 4 City is home to the largest portion of Medicaid recipients in the State of New York. These cuts 5 disproportionately hurt our most vulnerable 6 7 communities, but the solution is here right in front of us. Assembly Bill 2705, introduced by 8 9 Assemblymember Jessica Gonzalez-Rojas, and Senate Bill 4801 by Senator Gustavo Rivera would restore the 10 11 reimbursement rate to no less than 36 percent, 12 ensuring the full restoration of these programs and 13 helping DOHMH and our City partners to build a 14 healthier New York City. It is crucial that the State 15 advance this life-saving legislation as soon as 16 possible, which will restore millions of dollars for 17 critically needed health services. These cuts impact 18 those who are the most vulnerable in need of health 19 care and are totally unnecessary. Given the current 20 uncertainty of our federal public health funding, the issue of State Article VI funding is of the utmost 21 2.2 importance. The Legislature and the Governor must act 23 now to ensure that New York City residents receive equal access to the care they need. As Chair of the 24 Health Committee, I have advocated and will continue 25

2	to advocate for a restoration of Article VI funding.
3	I look forward to working with our state partners to
4	pass this urgently needed legislation.
5	I want to conclude by thanking Speaker
6	Adams for her support in prioritizing this issue. I
7	also want to thank the Committee Staff for their
8	work, Committee Counsels Chris Pepe and Sarah Sucher,
9	policy analyst Joshua Newman, and the finance staff,
10	Danielle Heifetz and Florentine Kabore, as well as my
11	team, Jonathan Boucher, Kevin McAleer, and Abigail
12	Zucker.
