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CHAIRPERSON BREWER: Good morning. My name is Gale Brewer and I am chair of Governmental Operations. I'm here with Council Member Vallone, council Member Dickens, and with David Seitzer who's counsel to the committee and Tim Medisoft who's a policy analyst and certainly the great council Jim Karis[phonetic]. And I, we are meeting this morning to vote on a bill proposing to a number 1722-A. This would implement many of the recommendations of the joint manorial council appointed lobby commission which was chaired by former Council Member Ruby Burma. The commission was formed in 2011 and worked for two years to develop a detailed set of recommendations on ways to improve the city's lobbying laws. The final report was issued earlier this year. I thank the commission members for all of their hard work and I am happy to be cosponsoring with Speaker to legislation implementing their recommendations. We heard this bill previously in the committee on November 7. Legislative us, before us today endeavors to one expand and clarify the definition of lobbying while increasing the dollar threshold

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so that small organizations and businesses will have their obligations reduced or eliminated. That was at the result of many discussions. Two enhance education and outreach and expand enforcement efforts by the clerk, the city clerk to bring unregistered lobbyists into the system. Three, continue making technological upgrades to the system so that it's transparent for the public and user friendly for lobbyists. I think that's going to take a little bit more time which is what we learned on November 7th. The resolution recommended by the commission will be voted on in this committee next week. So unless there are any questions I would like to call the vote. Oh we're going to read a statement also first from counsel to the committee David Seitzer.

DAVID SEITZER: This is David Seitzer counsel to the committee. There was a recent city clerk opinion that indicated under a certain fact pattern that communications with the Mayor's Office of Environmental Coordination over seer would not constitute lobbying. While not opining for the clerk we would expect that given the same facts a representative speaking to the Mayor's Office of
