In October, this Committee held a difficult but very important hearing on sexual assault and harassment in city jails and, at the hearing, we examined what appears to be a chasm between the Department of Corrections' written policies to prevent and address sexual abuse and the

reality for both those in the Department's custody and those who work on Rikers Island. Today, the bills we are voting on will move us forward to ensure that we have an accurate understanding of the scope of sexual assault and harassment within our city jails as well as how the Department of Correction is investigating allegations. I invite the lead sponsors to speak on their bills.

I'm going to start with Council Member Rivera.

COUNCIL MEMBER RIVERA: Good morning.

Thank you, Chair Nurse, for the opportunity to deliver brief remarks on my bill that we are voting on today, and thank you for your leadership on this issue.

Today, we're voting on Intro. 792, which will require the Department of Corrections to implement an electronic case management system to track investigations of sexual abuse. At our hearing on this bill, we heard from survivors of sexual violence in New York City-operated jails who made clear the need for greater oversight to ensure that investigations into sexual violence are completed within 90 days as mandated by local and federal

CHAIRPERSON NURSE: Thank you, Council
Member Rivera. I now turn it over to Council Member
Stevens.

COUNCIL MEMBER STEVENS: Thank you, Chair Nurse, for your leadership and approach in this Committee. I'm honored here today to take this

2 important step with the passage of Intro. 735, which 3 requires Department of Corrections to report on 4 incidents of sexual assault and harassment against correctional officer staff to ensure they have access to critical mental health resources. This legislation 6 is about accountability, protection, and compassion. Correctional officer staff put their safety on the 8 line every day, and they deserve to work in an environment that prioritizes their well-being. With 10 11 this bill, we are making it clear that their 12 experience matters, their safety matters, and their 13 mental health matters. Too often, we focus on 14 accountability without ensuring that we have the 15 tools and resources to heal. But healing is essential for progress as individuals and as a city. If we 16 17 truly want to build a more just and equitable 18 society, we must invest in policies that protect 19 people while also providing them with the care they 20 need to move forward. With strong support from the 21 City Council, this legislation reflects our strong 2.2 commitment to justice, dignity, and humanity. It 2.3 sends a powerful message not just to correctional officers, but every worker across the city 24 industries, no one should have to endure harassment 25

3	feel safe, valued, and respected. Thank you to all my
4	Colleagues, and I'm excited about this bill passing
5	today. Thank you.
