State Legislation Resolution requesting the New York State Legislature to pass a bill introduced by Senator Maltese S.1958 and Assembly Member Seminerio A.3866, "AN ACT to amend the retirement and social security law, in relation to eligibility of uniformed personnel of the New York city department of correction for ordinary disability benefits."
