SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Thank you. Good morning and welcome to the New York City remote hearing on environmental protection. At this time will all council members and council staff please turn on your videos? Thank you. To minimize disruptions please place all electronic devices to vibrate or silent mode. Thank you. Chair Constantinides, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON CONSTANTINIDES: Right, thank
you, Sergeant-At-Arms, always, for getting us
started. Good morning. Welcome everyone. I am Council
Member Costa Constantinides, Chair of the
Environmental Protection Committee. Say well here and
vote on intra 2170A in relation to a sustainable
energy loan program.

In 2019 we passed local law 96 of 2019 creating a sustainable energy loan program intended to assist property owners who wish to implement energy efficiency and renewable energy projects at their property. The Property Assessed Clean Energy Program or PACE, for short, offers affordable financing that allows property owners to pay for

COMMITTEE ON ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION upgrades and improve energy efficiency, harness renewable energy and conserve water. Without energy efficiency and renewable energy technologies we have no path to a sustainable future. PACE allows the property owner to finance the upfront cost of energy or other eligible improvements to a property and then pay the cost back over time through a voluntary assessment. The unique characteristic of PACE assessment is that the assessment is attached to the property rather then the individual. PACE programs enable property owners to avoid high upfront costs related to installing the energy technology such as solar panels or energy sustaining retrofits. Property owners may also see reduced energy bills as a result of upgraded financing through the program. The PACE program allows access to a low interest long-term loan. PACE programs allow property owners to pay for these improvements over time through assessments on their property tax bill. Once a property owner options the PACE financing the property remains subject to the PACE arrangement even if it's sold, transferred, or proposed upon. 2170A would amend the previously enacted sustainable energy loan program to permit energy efficiency improvements to be

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1 COMMITTEE ON ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION 2 incorporated into real property as an improvement or a component of a new or existing building. It also 3 4 defines real property, I mean any property, any 5 interest in which is eligible to be recorded with the register or the office of office of the Richmond 6 7 County Clerk by the possessor of such interest. For most property owners the biggest impediment to 8 transition to renewable energy is upfront costs. The 9 PACE program removes this stumbling block and allows 10 property owners to easily finance the installation of 11 modern heating, cooling, fuel efficiency at new... to 12 new, to new and existing property. This has the 13 14 potential not only to increase the supply of 15 renewable energy coming into the city grid, but also 16 address the, the largest driver of greenhouse gas 17 emissions, which are large buildings. Before I begin 18 I... Before I end, I would like to thank our staff.
