Proposed Intro No. / Title: Int. 1028 / Automatic enrollment of eligible individuals in city-created benefit programs

Summary of Legislation: Requires the Department of Social Services (DSS) to establish an automated enrollment system for "City-created benefits" using data from tax records and social services assistance rolls, without requiring an application from eligible individuals. The legislation further requires that eligible individuals be notified of their automatic enrollment including a description of the program, any costs associated with program participation, and an opt-out mechanism from the program. Requires that notifications and services be available in the citywide languages. Authorizes DSS to promulgate rules to implement this law.
