### **The Following 2 items will be heard jointly with the Committee on Veterans**

**Res 0042-2006** Resolution calling upon the New York State Legislature to amend Sections 458 and 458-a of the New York Real Property Tax Law, in relation to extending partial property tax exemption provisions of such sections to the school tax portion

of New York State property taxes for qualified veterans.

**Res 0962-2007** Resolution calling upon the New York State Legislature to introduce and adopt, and the Governor to sign, legislation which would amend the New York State Real Property Tax Law (RPTL) to expand the veterans' property tax exemption to include an exemption on the school portion of the tax for veterans with incomes below \$47,500 and to increase the maximum income eligibility thresholds of the Senior Citizen Homeowners Exemption (SCHE) program and the Disabled Homeowners Exemption (DHE) program to the same level.
