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Brooklyn, Council Member Frank Morano from Staten

Island, Council Member Lynn Schulman from Queens, and

the former Chair of this Committee and the topic of

today's conversation, Council Member Gale Brewer.

Today, we will be voting on Intro. 1225, sponsored by our next speaker, Council Member Julie Menin. This bill would establish an Office of the Census, which would be tasked with maximizing local participation in the federal decennial census. Ensuring that every single New Yorker is counted in the census is absolutely critical. In fact, if we had a few more hundred people counted last time, we would have an extra congressional seat. We cannot afford to lose any more congressional seats or any federal funding that is associated with the loss of those seats. Council Member Menin took on the Herculean task of impressively leading our census efforts in 2020, resulting in NYC having the highest response rate of any major city in the nation. I appreciate her continued leadership on this important issue and her dedication to make sure that future counts are a success.
