Transmitted here with are the bills signed by the Mayor. The bills are as follows:

Int. 743-A – Local Law 104

A Local Law to amend the New York city charter and the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to the establishment of an office of labor standards, and to repeal subdivision (i) of section 20-a of such charter and section 20-925 of such code, relating to the designation of an agency to enforce the Earned Sick Time Act.

Int. 783-A – Local Law 105

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to the interest rate applied to unpaid charges for emergency repairs performed by the department of housing preservation and development.

Int. 890-A – Local Law 106

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to the retention of data on the open data portal.

Int. 898-A – Local Law 107

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to requiring a data dictionary for every data set on the open data portal

Int. 900-A – Local Law 108

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to the standardization of address and geospatial information on the open data portal.

Int. 914-A – Local Law 109

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to establishing response timelines for public requests on the open data portal.

Int. 915-A – Local Law 110

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to the timely updating of certain public data sets on the open data portal.


Int. 956-A – Local Law 111

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to extending the biotechnology credit against the unincorporated business tax and the general corporation tax.

Int. 982^A – Local Law 112

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to extending the rate of the additional tax on the occupancy of hotel rooms.
