SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning, good morning. This is a microphone check on the Committee of Cultural Affairs, Libraries and International Intergroup Relations, recorded by James Marino, in the Hearing Room 3 on 12-18-2025.

Today, the Committee will consider Proposed Resolution Number 649-A, sponsored by Council Member Gale Brewer, which would call on the United States Congress to pass and the President to sign legislation allocating funds for the restoration of the SS United States for its relocation to the City of New York.

And we will hear a Pre-Considered  
Resolution sponsored by the Public Advocate, Mr.  
Williams, and Council Member Keith Powers, which  
would celebrate the New York Knicks in a spectacular  
win of the 2025 Emirates NBA Cup Championship.

Now, I would like to thank the Committee  
Staff who worked on preparing for today, including  
Christina Yellamaty, the Committee's Counsel; Regina  
Paul, the Committee's Senior Policy Analyst who  
worked on both Resolutions; and Sandra Gray, the  
Committee's Financial Analyst.

And if there's no public testimony, oh,  
hi, Council Member Brewer. Now, let me ask Council  
Member Brewer to deliver remarks on her Resolution.

COUNCIL MEMBER BREWER: Thank you very  
much.

I am talking about 649-A, and basically  
it is a Resolution in support of the SS United  
States. This is a ship that is presently in  
Mississippi. It was in Philadelphia, but it started  
in New York City, and it's one of the unique examples  
of a liner that crossed the seas many, many times.  
The challenge is that apparently a, I would say a  
county in Florida has decided that it's better to

have it as a coral reef than as a ship. So we are trying as a last-ditch effort with many of the people who love the SS United States to maintain it. The outside is still intact, the bow and the stern. The inside has been somewhat demolished, I will say. So I'm here to say thank you to all who are interested in this crazy idea that we want to save this ship, and it is stunning. I think if you were at the hearing, you would have seen a huge photograph of this amazing ship, and it is a shame that it would not continue so we're still trying. It may be a Hail Mary, but we are still trying to save it, and I thank everybody who signed on as a co-sponsor, and yay to the SS United States. Thank you very much.
