Welcome to New York City Council's remote committee hearing on Women and Gender Equity. Everyone, please turn on your videos at this time. Silence all electronic devices. Any written testimony can be submitted to <a href="testimony@council.nyc.gov">testimony@council.nyc.gov</a>. Thank you, Chair Cabán, we're ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON CABÁN: Great, thank you. Good morning. I'll go ahead and gavel us in. [GAVEL]. So we're going to commence this hearing. We know that the imposing majority of people who survive abuse and gender based violence don't report as much to law enforcement. Many avoid interactions with police because of prior negative experiences or because they don't want their assailant imprisoned or because of immigration status precarious or their undocumented and they fear deportation. And so for that reason alone Resolution 0025 when implemented by the State takes us a big step forward. And I want to extend my gratitude to Council Member Narcisse for bringing this important Resolution to the Council and for partnering with me on it.

And I also want to recognize my colleagues that have joined us. We have Council Members Gutiérrez, Gennaro, Stevens, Richardson Jordan and Riley. And thank you to all of the staff. I'm going to go ahead and turn it over to Billy for roll call and then we'll do remarks by Council Member Narcisse. Or do we want to do it the other way around? Other way around? Perfect. Okay. So then I'm going to hand it over to my colleague.

COUNCIL MEMBER NARCISSE: Good morning everyone.

I thank Chair Cabán for being such a dedicated

partner in getting us here today on the cusp of

passing an important Resolution that we hope will

serve as a catalyst for change. When the system is

broken as elected officials it is our duty to fix it.

There is no doubt that accessing crime victim

compensation is part of a broken system.

In the United States each year over 50 percent of violent victimizations go unreported to law enforcement. The law enforcement reporting requirement for victim compensation adversely impacts Black and Brown communities who are less likely than other groups to report their harm to law enforcement due to distrust, through by years of well-documented

racial profiling, police violence and impunity.

Black men and with lower incomes living in New York

City are more likely to be criminally victimized than
any other group but are among those least likely to

receive victim compensation.

Other marginalized population, including immigrant communities, members of the LBGTQIA plus, community survivors, survivors or gender-based violence may choose not to report their harm to police due to fear of retaliation, fear of deportation or unfair treatment or the dynamics of inter-partner relationships.

Conversely, the majority of recipients of victim compensation are White women between the age of 29 to 59. This is a broken system. And we stand ready to do our part to fix it. That's the step we take this morning with my partner Cabán, my City Council that's very dynamic pushing forward for equity.

So tomorrow with the help of my colleagues and the Council, I expect to pass the Resolution 0025, which calls upon the New York State Legislator to pass 886-19A and S75-73, Senator Myrie, of course, to expand eligibility for victims and survivors of crime to acts of victim compensation funds. Let's help fix
