Local Law to amend the Administrative Code of the

City of New York in relation to written lactation

room accommodation policies. We will also be voting on Council Member Gutierrez's Proposed Intro. 912-B, a Local Law to amend the Administrative Code of the City of New York in relation to requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to develop and distribute parenting resource materials to parents and guardians of newborn children, and Council Member Gutierrez's Proposed Intro. 869-A, a Local Law to amend the Administrative Code of the City of New York in relation to outreach and education regarding parental mental health resources.

Additionally, we'll be voting on two
Resolutions today. Resolution number 133A-2024,
sponsored by Council Member Menin, a Resolution
calling on the New York State Legislature to pass and
the Governor to sign legislation to increase Medicaid
reimbursement to cover eight pre- and post-natal
visits as well as delivery support by doulas. And
finally, Resolution 293-2024, sponsored by Council
Member Stevens, which is a Resolution calling upon
the New York State Legislature to pass and the
Governor to sign S.2898A and A.4017A, the Chisholm
Chance Act, which would establish a plan to address

Now I invite Council Member Menin to provide remarks on her legislation.

COUNCIL MEMBER MENIN: Thank you so much, Chair Louis. Today I'm honored to speak about my resolution, Resolution 133, that calls on the New York State Legislature to pass and the Governor to sign legislation to increase Medicaid reimbursement to cover eight pre- and post-natal visits as well as delivery support by doulas. Doulas provide very important emotional, physical, and educational support to a mother who is expecting, is experiencing labor, or who has recently given birth, and should be more accessible to all New Yorkers. In fact, according to the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, only 5.5 percent of New Yorkers who gave birth last year relied on a doula. This is up from 4.7 percent in the previous year, according to this report from last August, but the rate is, quite frankly, far too low. As New Yorkers seek doula support, there remain fiscal challenges. An equitable Medicaid reimbursement rate would ensure greater access for doulas and increased post-natal visits.

I want to thank the Chair for allowing me to speak and for my Colleagues for joining me on this Resolution, and I also want to thank the drafter, Cristy Dwyer, and from my team, Jonathan Szott, Brandon Jordan, and Mercedes Anderson. Thank you.
