New Need Highlights

- Master Plan: \$6.7 million to support Transportation Master Plan, which
 calls for the installation and expansion of protected bike lanes, bus stop
 upgrades, intersection redesigns, and other major transportation project.
- **Speed Camera Expansion: \$46.4 million** for OTPS costs associated with speed camera program expansion.
- Crash Investigation Unit: \$3.1 million to establish unit required by local law 49 of 2021 passed by the Council in March 2021.
- Install 10,000 Bike Racks: \$3.6 million to install 10,000 bike racks over two-calendar years.

Other Adjustment Highlights

- Greenwave Program: \$1.2 million to enhance street safety.
- City Cleanup Corp: \$4.7 million in federal funding to support 102 full-time jobs and provide maintenance and operational support for the Open Streets Program, pedestrian plazas, Street Seats, and other public spaces.
- Permanent Open Restaurants: \$6.3 million to give year-round permanent extension to program
