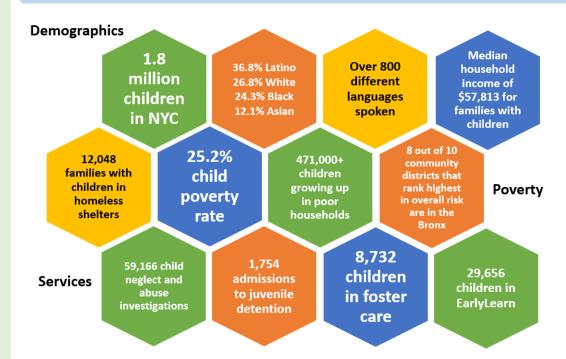

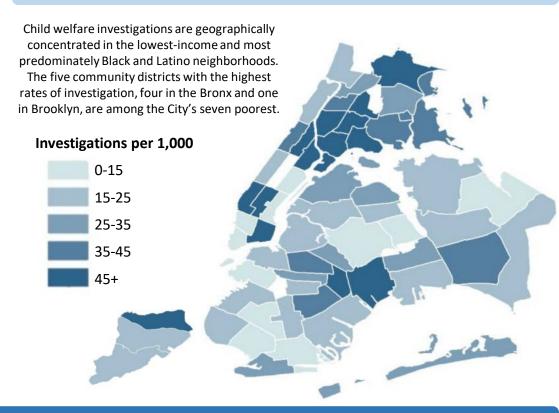

Demographics, Poverty, and Services Overview



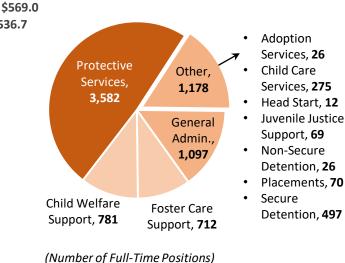
Child Welfare Investigations by Community District



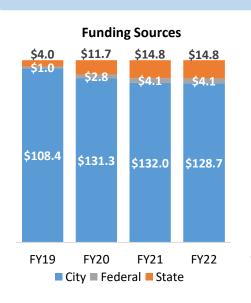

Program Area Headcount

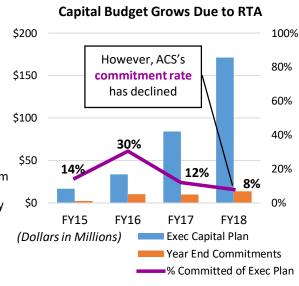

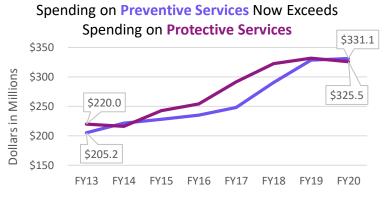






Preventive and Protection Services

Child Care and EarlyLearn



Seven Month Delay: EarlyLearn transfer to DOE now begins in **FY20**, with rebid awards to commence in **FY21**.



Pay Parity: There is no funding in FY20 to achieve teacher pay parity, although teachers employed by CBOs have a starting salary around \$42,000, while those employed by DOE earn around \$59,000.



Special Child Care Funding (SCCF): \$27.4 million baselined to support 3,489 child care vouchers in FY19.



City-Leased Day Care Sites: 70 programs are currently DCAS-managed, but it remains unclear how these will be transferred to DOF.



PINS Threat: The State Executive Budget would eliminate **\$13 million** in support for preventive diversion services that are provided to Persons in Need of Supervision (PINS) before foster care is necessitated.
