Richmond County to succeed John W. Zaccone who has been servicing as a holdover. Simon Shamoun, Kings County for reappointment. Keith Sullivan, Queens County to succeed Michael Michel who has been serving as a holdover. Gino A. Marmorato, Bronx County for reappointment. And Fred M. Umane, New York County for reappointment. If appointed, all five of the main under of a four year term expiring December 31st, 2024. Commissioners receive a \$300 per diem for each day of attendance at BOE meetings or any of its committees with a maximum of 30,000 per year. Under the default appointment process within 30 days after County organization files a proper Certificate of Party Recommendation with the city clerk office, the full Council can vote to appoint the person designated on the certificate. In these cases, the Republican communities of the aforementioned counties did not file the required certificates by the statutory deadline as set by the New York State election law. As a consequence, pursuant to New York State election law section 3204, subsection 4, Council members who are members of the Republican party may appoint any eligible person. Eligibility requirements are limited to being a registered
