Commissioners receive a \$300 per 22 23 diem for each day of attendance at BOE meetings or 24 any of its committees with a maximum of \$30,000 per

We received it within a matter of 2.2 days. I'm not sure of the exact. Chuck, what was 2.3 the date that we received it in terms of timeliness? Well, the previous CHARLES DAVID: 24

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2 COUNCIL MEMBER KALLOS: As I do with nearly every appointment we vote on in the Council, I took 3 4 my opportunity to interview Jodi Morales who has been nominated as Bronx Democratic Commissioner for the Board of Elections. She is a fellow graduate of the 6 7 State University of New York at Buffalo and has had a 8 distinguished career for more than a decade at the Bronx Defenders. In our interview, Morales has said she would take on nepotism by reforming the Committee 10 11 for Ethical Hiring Processes. Morales says that when 12 it comes to patronage qualifications, incompetence 13 matters. Morale shares reports of difficulty registering at pull sites and made a commitment to 14 15 register more residents in partnership with civic organizations. Morales agreed that no one should 16 17 have to wait more than 10 minutes to vote and she 18 will at pull sites for early vote and election day to 19 Morales understands the importance of paper-20 based ballots and will support online voter 21 registration, no-fault vote by mail, and same-day 2.2 registration. Morales will support foreign language 2.3 speakers who need translation services beyond those required by the Voting Rights Act. Morales 24

understands that the city Council will be voting to
