SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good afternoon and welcome to today's remote New York City Council hearing for the Committee on Public Housing. At this time, we ask that all Council members and Council staff please turn on their videos for verification purposes. CHAIRPERSON AMPRY-SAMUEL: Hello,
everyone, and thank you for coming. I am Council
member Alicka Ampry-Samuel, Chair of the Council's
Committee on Public Housing. I am joined today by
Council member Van Bramer, Council member Gjonaj,
Council member Riley, Council member Ayala, Council
member Salamanca, Council member Feliz, and Council
member Menchaca and if I did not say your name, I
apologize and we will make sure that you are noticed
and on record. We are here today to vote on two
resolutions: Reso number 1201, sponsored by Council
member Rivera, calling on Congress to pass and the
president to sign the Public Housing Emergency

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Response Act and Reso number 1222, also sponsored by Council member Rivera calling on Congress to pass and the president to sign the Green New Deal for Public Housing Act. Both pieces of federal legislation would be instrumental in bringing much-needed federal dollars in support to the nation's crumbling public housing stock, especially NYCHA. Both would go a long way in reversing the decades of disinvestment from and neglect of public housing. NYCHA's last physical needs assessment, completed 2017, estimated \$31.8 billion in capital needs repair. We know the true number is far greater. The federal bills that these two resolutions support would help NYCHA to make necessary capital repairs the correct mold, replace boilers, abate lead, fix leaking roofs, and repair elevators also creating many decent, wellpaying jobs. In the Green New Deal would help ensure that those repairs can get done in the manner that is in line with the city's ambitious yet achievable climate goals. I would like to commend my colleague, Council member Carlina Rivera, for sponsoring this legislation and working to improve the lives of our city's public housing residents. His Council member Rivera here to speak on her bills?
