SERGEANT LEONARDO: Good morning, and welcome to today's remote New York City Council hearing for the Committee on Finance. At this time, we recommend that council members and staff turn off their video for verification purposes. To minimize disruptions throughout the hearing, please place your cell phones and electronic devices to vibrate or silent. Thank you for your cooperation. Chair, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: Thank you. Good morning.

Welcome to today's Finance Committee meeting. My

name is Councilmember Justin Brannan. I am the chair

of the Finance Committee. I want to first

acknowledge my colleagues who have joined us this

morning, Councilmembers Louis, Barron, Carr,

Velázquez, Brooks-Powers, Moya, Ossé, Farías, Kagan,

Hanks, Won, Ayala, and Brewer, and if more join us, I

will acknowledge them.

Today, we have 3 items on the agenda, an Article XI property tax exemption and 2 bid items. So let's start with the Land Use item, which his 1312 Beach Channel Drive, located in Far Rockaway, in Minority Whip Brooks-Powers's district. The proposed

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development, which would consist of a single 8-story building that would include both a 100-bed shelter and 147 units of supportive housing, which would be supported by a 40-year full Article XI tax exemption. Minority Whip Brooks-Powers is supportive of the project, and I want to give the Minority Whip an opportunity to make her remarks now.

COUNCILMEMBER BROOKS-POWERS: Good morning everyone, and thank you Chair Brannan and The Committee for convening today's hearing. Before we begin with the vote agenda, I wanted to speak briefly about the item in my district, approving an Article XI property tax exemption at 1312 Beach Channel Drive in downtown Far Rockaway.

The tax exemption will facilitate the development of a facility that will contain a supportive housing facility and a women's shelter. Shelters and supportive housing facilities provide critical services, and they are key to addressing the multiple crises of housing, employment, mental health that unhoused New Yorkers often face. However, these investments must be made with equity in mind. We must ensure that our resources and support are distributed equitably across our city's districts.

my council district overlaps with(2:45) wards			
12, 13, and 14. These 3 community districts contain			
over half of the shelter beds sited in the entire			
borough of Queens. An additional shelter of the			
originally proposed size would bring a serious drain			
on our local infrastructure in an area that has			
already seen our development skyrocket. In light of			
this reality, I would like to acknowledge the staff			
at DHS and HPD as well as the team at BRC for their			
partnership in coming to the table to ensure that the			
needs of the community are prioritized on this			
project. The city has agreed to substantially reduce			
the size of the shelter component of this project by			
100 beds and has also agreed to a reduction of			
shelter beds across my district by the end of the			
year, and an indefinite moratorium on new sitings			
while the city announces and analyzes its shelter			
placement plan.			

Thanks also to the Committee's Assistant Counsel,
Noah Brick, for his assistance on this item, and I
encourage my colleagues to vote in support of this
project. And thank you Chair Brannan for this time.

CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: Thank you, Majority Whip Brooks-Powers. I also want to acknowledge that we

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2 have been joined by Councilmembers Powers, Sanchez, 3 and Hudson.

So next the bid up. There are 2 bid items: Intro 47, which would establish the Castle Hill Business Improvement District in Councilmember Farias' Council District. The proposed bid is generally bound from the Cross Bronx Expressway to Manning Street along the east and west side of Castle Hill Avenue, from Olmstead Avenue to just east of Glebe Avenue, along the south side of Westchester Avenue, and from Union Point Road to just east of Glebe Avenue, along the north side of Westchester The bid area is a neighborhood commercial Avenue. corridor comprised primarily of smaller one- and twostory buildings with residential uses on the upper floors. Of the district's 97 properties, 94 are partially or wholly commercial with ground-floor retail use and some second-floor residential space. The bid projects a first-year budget of \$300,000, in which it proposes to offer such things as marketing, holiday lighting, street cleaning, graffiti removal, administration services, and advocacy services. Intro 73 would establish the West Village bid in Councilmember Bottcher's district. The proposed bid

generally includes blocks on 5 major commercial
strips, Seventh Avenue south, the west side of Avenue
of the Americas, Bleeker Street, Christopher Street,
and West 4th. It also includes smaller commercial
and mixed-use streets that intersect the above-
mentioned streets that are heavily trafficked by
neighborhood visitors and residents. The proposed
district contains approximately 872 properties, 60
percent of which are commercial or mixed use after
adjusting for residential condos. The bid projects a
first-year budget of approximately \$600,000 in which
it proposes to offer marketing, holiday lighting,
street cleaning, graffiti removal, administration and
advocacy services. \$600,000 is also the maximum
budget permitted under the current local law.

On March 24, 2022, this Committee held a public hearing to consider both Intros 47 and 73. We heard testimony in support of both of the bids respective establishments as required by law. That hearing closed without a vote and the 30-day period began, to allow property owners affected by the establishment of the relevant bids to formally object to the proposed action.

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According to the city clerk with whom these objection would be filed, one property owner filed a valid objection to the creation of the West Village bid during the 30-day period. For the Castle Hill bid, however, no property owners filed a valid objection to the creation of the bid during that 30 days.

Accordingly, this Committee may now vote in favor of Intro 47 and 73 if we can answer the following 4 questions in the affirmative:

Question 1: Were all notices of hearing for all hearings required to be held published and mailed as so required by law and otherwise sufficient?

Question 2: Does all the real property within the districts boundaries benefit from the establishment or the expansion of the district, except as otherwise provided by law?

Question 3: Is all real property benefitted by the districted included within the district?

Question 4: Is the establishment or expansion of the district in the best interest of the public.

Representatives from SBS, the Department of Small Business Services are here to testify to help us answer shows 4 questions on the 2 bid items. Before

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we turn to SBS, I want to invite Councilmember Farias to speak in support of the establishment of the Castle Hill bid.

Is Councilmember Farias here?

COUNCILMEMBER FARIAS: I'm here. Sorry. I am just getting off... just getting off the ferry today.

CHAIRPERSON BARRAN: It's okay. Right on.

asking me to come say a couple of words. I will say that I am in full support of the bid development and the Intros today, and I urge all of my colleagues to support it. It is a long time coming, as I have stated before, for this bid to be created and the formation from before my 2 predecessors, beginning through the pandemic, these businesses have pulled through, and stayed organized and committed to this effort, and so I urge my colleagues to vote yes today. Thank you for giving me a moment to acknowledge its creation and all of the hard work that has been put into that.

CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: Thank you Councilmember.

Okay. Now, I am going to ask my counsel to swear in the representative from the department of Small Business Services before they give their testimony.

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COUNSEL BRICK: Mr. Brannan, do you affirm that the testimony that you will give today before this Committee will be truthful to the best of your knowledge, information, and belief?

CALVIN BROWN: I do.

COUNSEL BRICK: I'm sorry. You may begin.

CALVIN BROWN: Okay. Thank you. Good morning Chair Brannan and the members of the Finance Committee. I'm Calvin Brown. I'm the Assistant Commissioner for Neighborhood Development at the Department of Small Business Services. Today, we would like to report on the results of the objections filed with the City Clerk against the establishment of the proposed Castle Hill business improvement district. As required by law, the Castle Hill Steering Committee mailed the summary of City Council Resolution to the following parties: To each owner of real property within the proposed district at the address shown at the latest city assessment role, to such other persons as registered with the city to receive tax bills, concerning real property within the district, and to tenants of each building within the proposed district. Furthermore, SBS arranged a publication of a copy of the summary of the

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resolution at least once in the city records. 2 3 conclusion of the objection period at 5 p.m. on April 4 22, 2022, and taking into consideration any 5 objections postmarked by that date, no objections were filed with the City Clerk for the properties 6 7 within the district. The Department of Small 8 Business Services supports the establishment of the proposed Castle Hill bid. In our judgment, the proposed bid will improve the quality of life and 10 business conditions in the Castle Hill district. 11

COUNSEL BRICK: Yes. That's fine.

CALVIN BROWN: Alright. Thank you.

You know, it started off worse than what it was before, but honesty compels me to be consistent and not vote in favor of it, even though I am glad that you did get it down to 100 and a commitment to reduce more in other areas of your community, but this is in violation of the Fair Share ACT, where communities that are oversaturated with homeless shelters should not be building more homeless shelters, and the city should be supporting putting those 100 units into permanent housing, which has happened in other areas. It should be permanent housing. We will never get rid of homelessness building more shelters, but to you, you are open to try to fight it to the best of your ability, so I do want to commend you for that, but I have to be consistent and say I vote no for that item, and Aye on all the rest.

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2 CLERK MARTIN: Thank you, Council Member. Just 3 to clarify, that was Beach Channel?

COUNCILPERSON BARRON: Mm-hmm.

CLERK MARTIN: Thank you. Council Member Brewer?

COUNCILPERSON BREWER: I vote Aye, but I do agree with Council Member Charles Barron that we need to have permanent housing, it's a fight every single time, and I think if we do more permanent housing, then we will not have as many people applying to be the next transitional building, so we have got to work on it because there are so many aspects of it, but I vote Aye and I know the fight continues. Thank
