1 COMMITTEE ON FIRE AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT aimed to minimize fire safety risks posed by 2 overheating and tipping over.

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Second, Proposed Introduction 131-A, sponsored by Council Member Pierina Sanchez, will require the Fire Department to conduct fire safety education and outreach related to the safe operation of electric space heaters in residential settings. Additionally, the law will require that all safety materials disseminated by the Fire Department will be made in the top 10 most commonly spoken languages in the City.

Introduced in response to the deadly Twin Parks fire earlier this year, which was started by a malfunctioning space heater, these common sense measures will promote public safety, by ensuring that space heaters sold in New York City are equipped with industry standard safety features and that New Yorkers are sufficiently educated on safe operations of these commonly used devices.

I want to thank the administration and council staff for all of the work they have done in finalizing this legislation.

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        I just want to speak just for a second on
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     Introduction 131-A, which I have introduced, and it
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     coming for a vote today. As The Chair has said, it
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     will expand educational outreach and increase
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     language access for so many immigrant communities
     across New York City. There has been a lot that we
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    have heard throughout the past few months about the
     work that the FDNY does and that the City of New York
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does to educate communities on fire safety. But,

1 COMMITTEE ON FIRE AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT language access has been a recurring theme in terms 2 3 of what we need to do better; we need to provide more 4 language access. And, one particular thing that I am 5 excited about is for Introduction 131, uh, the educational material that will be produced through 6 7 this bill will include the new restrictions that will be created through Council Member Hanif's 8 Introduction 106. So, you know, this... This is the first package 10 11 of legislation addressing the Twin Parks fire. 12 just a start. Uh, just a little while ago, we voted for a few bills out of The Housing and Buildings 13 14 Committee. And, this does not mean that we now rest. 15 We continue to improve building and fire safety in 16 tangible ways across the City of New York, including holding our landlords accountable, modernizing our 17 fire and building codes, and ensuring code 18 19 enforcement is working in the best interests of all New Yorkers. 20 21 So, thank you so much, uh, Chair Ariola for this 2.2 today. 2.3 CHAIRPERSON ARIOLA: Thank you, Council Member.

2 COUNCIL MEMBER FELIZ: Thank you so much,

Chairwoman Ariola. I want to thank all of my colleagues, uh, who have been working on these many different pieces of fire safety legislation.

On the issue of fire safety, we must do many things including: Number one, tackling the issues related to the causes of fire --including defective space heaters and also space heaters that are unsafe; at the same time we have to work on additional legislation to make sure that, in the case where there is a fire, families could safely escape. And this is why, uh, we were able to work on self-closing door laws.

I want to thank all of my colleagues for the different pieces of legislation that we are working on, on additional fire safety, uh, and I am looking very forward to continuing to work to, uh, tackle all of the causes of fires including space heaters, but also E-bikes, which is an emerging problem, and many more issues.

I want to congratulate all of my colleagues for all of the work they have done on this issue. Thank you so much.

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I would now like to ask Council Member Hanif to speak on the bill that she is proposing.

COUNCIL MEMBER HANIF: Thank you so much, Chair Ariolai, good afternoon, everybody. I appreciate you, Chair Ariola, for including Introduction 106-A on today's agenda, and for your proactive support on this bill.

Thank you to Council Member Feliz for introducing this bill with me, and uh, for you continued leadership on this issue in the face of immeasurable pain.

And, thank you to many members of this committee for signing on as sponsors including: Council Member Riley, Council Member Yeger, Council Member Holden, Council Member Yeger, Council Member De La Rosa, and Council Member Schulman.

I also want to thank committee staff for your tireless, tireless, work.

The tragic and avoidable Twin Parks fire in

Council Member Feliz's district was caused by a space

heater that was on a prolonged period of time and

then overheated. Incidents like this are a leading

cause of fires. And, according The Consumer Product Safety Commission, portable heaters are involved in about 1,700 fires per year nationwide, resulting in about 80 deaths and 160 injuries. Unfortunately, we know that we cannot eliminate space heater usage in New York City. And, while landlords have an obligation to their tenants to provide adequate heating, this obligation is often not met, and residents are forced to use heaters to stay warm.

Introduction 106-A will ensure that heaters are as safe as possible in order to prevent future tragedies. If passed, this require all space heaters sold in New York City to be equipped with one, a thermostat; two, an automatic function that disables the heater upon overheating or tipping over; and three, safety certification from a nationally recognized testing laboratory.

This would significantly reduce the risk of heater causing a fire. Along with the other bills on today's agenda, this legislation would go a long way in creating a safer city.
