Dear Chair Garodnick:

On October 25, 2022 the Land Use Committee of the City Council, by a vote of 9-0-0 for Application C 220414 ZMQ recommended modifications of the City Planning Commission's decision in the above-referenced matter.

Pursuant to Section 197-d(d) of the City Charter I hereby file the proposed modifications with the Commission:

Matter <u>double struck out</u> is old, deleted by the City Council; Matter <u>double-underlined</u> is new, added by the City Council

The Zoning Resolution of the City of New York, effective as of December 15, 1961, and as subsequently amended, is further amended by changing the Zoning Map, Section No. 14c:

- 1. eliminating from within an existing R4 District a C1-3 District bounded by a line 100 feet southerly of Union Turnpike, 164<sup>th</sup> Street, the westerly centerline prolongation of 81<sup>st</sup> Avenue, and a line midway between 162<sup>nd</sup> Street and 164<sup>th</sup> Street; <u>and</u>
- 2. eliminating from within an existing R5D District a C1-3 District bounded by Union Turnpike, 164<sup>th</sup> Street, a line 100 feet southerly of Union Turnpike, and 162<sup>nd</sup> Street;
- establishing within an existing R4 District a C2-3 District bounded by a line 100 feet southerly of Union Turnpike, 164<sup>th</sup> Street, the westerly centerline prolongation of 81<sup>st</sup>

Avenue, and a line midway between 162<sup>nd</sup> Street and 164<sup>th</sup> Street; and

4. establishing within an existing R5D District a C2-3 District bounded by Union Turnpike, 164<sup>th</sup> Street, a line 100 feet southerly of Union Turnpike, and 162<sup>nd</sup> Street;

as shown on a diagram (for illustrative purposes only) dated May 9, 2022, and subject to the conditions of CEQR Declaration E-678, Borough of Queens, Community District 8.
