I'm Council Member Pierina Sanchez, Chair of the Committee on Housing and Buildings, and we are here today to vote on three bills to help our city's aging population. The bills were first heard by the Committee on a joint hearing with the Aging Committee on October 3rd.

With over 1 million seniors in New York
City, more than children in New York City's public
schools, it is time to put attention to our city's
senior population. We need to meet the needs of these

New Yorkers so they can live with dignity in their			
homes. This includes features in buildings and			
apartments that make it easier for seniors to live			
safely and age in place. We cannot rely on landlords			
to make adjustments on a case-by-case for seniors. We			
must take action rather than put our senior			
population in a position where their only option will			
be to move. When new housing is being built, units			
need to be set aside for tenants who are disabled,			
and these units must be rented to persons with those			
disabilities. If a project is being built with city			
financing, it needs to be built with universal design			
features that ensures that an apartment is accessible			
to everyone, regardless of age or physical ability.			
The three bills we are voting on today will continue			
to push us forward in creating and maintaining a			
housing stock that meets the needs of the city's			
aging population and people with disabilities. By			
making our housing more accessible to those			
individuals, we are better able to meet the needs of			
all New Yorkers.
