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SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Test, test, test. This is a test on a vote on Parks and Recreation. Today's date is February 16, 2023. This is being recorded by Sakeem Bradley.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: At this time, can the host please start the webinar?

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning and welcome to the New York City Council vote of the Committee on Parks and Recreation.

At this time, can everyone please silence your cell phones? Thank you for your cooperation.

Chair, we are ready to begin.

So much, Sergeant. Good morning everyone and welcome to our Committee on Parks and Recreation hearing on February 16. Thank you all to my Colleagues and Members of the Committee who have joined. I'd like to read their names for the record, those who are present, Council Member Moya, Council Member Lee, Council Member Marte, Council Member Menin, Council Member Narcisse, Council Member Restler, Council Member Ung, Council Member Carr, and Council Member Eric Dinowitz. Welcome.

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Good morning. I am Council Member Shekar Krishnan, and I am pleased to Chair the Committee on Parks and Recreation. Today, the Committee will vote on Intro 897, a bill that would ceremonially co-name 129 thoroughfares and public places throughout the city. We first considered this bill at a Parks Committee hearing on January 31st.

Of the many honorees proposed by this piece of legislation, I'd like to call attention to a couple of co-namings that I am proud to have sponsored. One would be Bangladesh Street on 73rd Street in Jackson Heights honoring the Bangladeshi community of our city and recognizing the contributions that they have made and continue to be made by this community. It is the heart of our Bangladeshi community in Jackson Heights and a space of reflection of their power and presence in Jackson Height and across New York City. I am so proud about this co-naming and what it really reflects of the vibrant Bangladeshi culture and community here in Jackson Heights.

Another co-naming would recognize John Browne Way which would honor John Browne, an Irish immigrant who served in the U.S. Army and later

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became a local business and civic leader who engaged
in providing needed aid to other immigrants and
countless charitable activities. Looking forward to

5 his co-naming as well in our community of Elmhurst.

Finally, Asif Rahman Way would honor Asif Rahman who tragically died at the young age of 22 when he was struck by a freight truck on Queens Boulevard. Asif was a Bangladeshi immigrant who excelled in school and was a graduate of Queens College. His tragic death spurred his mother, Lizi Rahman, to create a campaign to make Queens Boulevard safer. As a result, over 10,000 people, hundreds of businesses, and dozens of organizations have supported the campaign by signing petitions, participating in community design workshops, and local rallies, all of which have helped to make changes to Queens Boulevard resulting in a safer street for pedestrians. It used to be called the number one boulevard of death in Queens because of the numerous pedestrian fatalities. However, over the years because of the work by our community led along the way by mother Lizi Rahman, I am proud that today there have been substantial improvements to Queens Boulevard to make it safer. I am so grateful for Lizi

I continue to have great reservations about this particular co-naming. This is an individual who again at the root of his organization had anti-Semitism and spoke about it throughout his life among many, many other controversial words and deeds, and, in my opinion, he is not worthy of having a street co-naming in the City of New York, and we should not even be considering this today, but here we are, and I feel that he fails every test we could possibly put forward, the test based on the values and views of today and the values and views of the time in which he lived and work so in my opinion, I think in the opinion of many in this Body and many in the public at large, this is not something we should be doing today, but, unfortunately, it is packaged with 128 other names, many of whom I know to be absolutely worthy of this distinction and I refuse to allow them

3	this package and so with that said, I vote aye.

7	sentiments of my Colleague, David Carr. I vote aye o
8	all.

10	you. By a vote of 12 in the affirmative, 0 in the
11	negative, and no abstentions, Introduction 897 has
12	been adopted by the Committee.
13	Mr. Chair, that is a full Committee.
