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1 COMMITTEE ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT 2 2 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: This is a microphone 3 check for the Committee on Economic Development. Today's date is March 16, 2023. Located in Council 4 Chambers. Recorded by Steve Sadowsky. 5 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning and 6 7 welcome to the New York City vote on the Committee on 8 Economic Development. 9 Chair, we are ready to begin. CHAIRPERSON FARIAS: Good morning. Today 10 11 is March 16th. My name is Amanda Farias, and I have the privilege of Chairing the Council's Committee on 12 Economic Development. 13 14 I would like to extend my thanks to the 15 Members of the Committee for coming together to hold 16 today's vote and welcome our newest member as she is 17 coming in, Council Member Vernikov. We're joined 18 today by Council Members Aviles, Kagan, Riley, and 19 Stevens. 20 The purpose of today's hearing is to vote 21 on a piece of legislation I sponsored and this Committee heard last fall. The bill, Proposed 2.2 23 Introduction 236A would require the inclusion of city high school students in the NYC Ferry Discount 24 Program and would memorialize the entire NYC Ferry 25

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Discount Program in the City's Administrative Code. 2 3 It would also ensure any future contracted ferry 4 service offered by the administration would maintain 5 the NYC Ferry Discount Program if the contract were overseen by a city agency other than the EDC. At 6 7 present, NYC Ferry costs 4 dollars for a regular adult fair, 27.50 for a 10-pack, and 1.35 for anyone 8 9 eligible for a discount through the NYC Ferry Discount Program. Currently, the discounts are 10 available to seniors, disabled persons, and low-11 12 income persons who participate in the City's Fair 13 Fares program. When this bill was originally heard by 14 this Committee last fall, I was moved by testimony 15 from several city high school students from the New 16 York City Harbor School, a public high school on 17 Governors Island, who take incredibly long commutes 18 from all over the city each day to get to school via 19 the ferry from Lower Manhattan. While NYC Ferry does 20 make stops at Governors Island and could provide some 21 students with a much shorter commute, it is difficult for these students to justify paying 8 dollars round-2.2 23 trip or 40 dollars a week to get to school. This bill will change that. Once the bill goes into effect, on 24 schooldays all of the city's public high school 25

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2	students will be eligible for the same reduced price
3	fair as seniors, disabled persons, and anyone
4	eligible for Fair Fares. While the enactment date of
5	this bill is not until next September, I have been in
6	talks with my Colleagues at EDC, and it is not lost
7	on us that the students at the Harbor School should
8	benefit from this bill sooner than later so please
9	stay tuned.
10	I would like to extend my thanks to EDC
11	for expressing an interest in working with us on this
12	bill and to my Colleagues at the Council for ensuring
13	that it made it this far and to the Harbor School for
14	pushing for this bill consistently since our last
15	hearing. This is a perfect example of government
16	advocacy in action.
17	Lastly, I'd like to thank my Staff,
18	Legislative Director Rebecca Nieves, my Economic
19	Development Committee Staff Senior Counsel Alex
20	Paulenoff, Policy Analyst William Hongach, and
21	Finance Analyst Glenn Martelloni for all of their
22	hard work negotiating this bill and ensuring it made
23	it to a vote.
24	With that, I'll now as the Clerk to
