1 COMMITTEE ON PARKS AND RECREATION 2 2 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Today's date is April 3 11, 2023. It's being recorded by Michael Leonardo in the Council Chambers. 4 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning and 5 welcome to today's New York City Council hearing for 6 7 the Committee on Parks and Recreation. At this time, we ask that you silence 8 9 cell phones and electronic devices to minimize disruptions throughout the hearing. We thank you for 10 11 your cooperation. 12 Chair, we are ready to begin. 13 CHAIRPERSON KRISHNAN: [GAVEL] Thank you 14 so much, Sergeant. Good morning, everyone. I am 15 Shekar Krishnan, Chair of the Committee on Parks and 16 Recreation, and I'd like to welcome all of you to 17 this hearing where the Committee will vote on 18 Proposed Intro number 128A. 19 This bill, sponsored by Council Member 20 Salamanca, would require that every park bathroom 21 have a safe, sanitary, and convenient diaper changing table. Currently, diaper changing tables are required 2.2 23 by Local Law 34 of 2018, which mandated that new or renovated buildings containing places of public 24 accommodation include diaper changing tables that are 25

2	accessible to everyone, regardless of gender, but it
3	did not apply to parks importantly. As any parent of
4	young children can attest, having access to changing
5	stations when visiting a park or playground is
6	something that is sorely lacking on a wide scale.
7	This bill is a straightforward solution to a problem
8	faced by so many parents who would like to spend even
9	more quality time with their children, benefitting
10	from our parks and open space.
11	The Committee first considered this piece
12	of legislation at a hearing on March 1, 2023, where
13	it received very favorable testimony. I congratulate
14	Council Member Salamanca for pursuing this important
15	and much needed legislation, and I urge all of my
16	fellow Committee Members to vote in favor of this
17	legislation.
