Today, the Committee will be voting on the following items. A Transparency Resolution and six property tax exemption resolutions.

First, the Transparency Resolution sets forth the new designation and changes in the designation of certain organizations receiving local aging and youth discretionary funding and funding

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pursuant to certain initiatives in the budget. As with all Transparency Resolutions, Council Members will have to sign a disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any of the groups on the attached list. If any Council Member has a potential conflict of interest with any of the organizations listed, they have the opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time of the vote. As a reminder, please disclose any conflicts you may have with proposed subcontractors used by organizations sponsored by discretionary funding. These disclosures must be made before the subcontractor can be approved. Disclosure forms must be completed and submitted prior to the vote on the Transparency Resolution and may be emailed to Julius Caranda who is also present and is always with us in the Chambers today to answer your questions.

The first property tax resolution amends
Resolution 569 of 2023 to make necessary technical
corrections to the text.

The second resolution authorizes a partial 40-year Article 11 exemption for one building in Council Member Osse's District. The exemption will regulate rents in the building at 50 percent of AMI.

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The third resolution authorizes a partial 40-year Article 11 exemption for two buildings in Council Member Moya's District. The exemption will extend and deepen existing affordability on the site after the building's 421A exemption expired.

The fourth resolution authorizes a partial 40-year Article 11 exemption for one agerestricted Section 8 building in Council Member Nurse's District. This exemption will preserve affordability following the building's refinance with a HUD mortgage.

The fifth resolution renews a previous

Article 5 exemption for one building in Council

Member Rivera's District. The exemption will regulate

rents in the building at 50 percent AMI.

The final but certainly not the least resolution authorizes a partial 40-year Article 11 exemption for one building in Council Member Osse's District. The exemption will regulate rents in the building at 50 percent AMI.

For the record, the property tax
resolution for six buildings in Council Member
Abreu's District has been withdrawn per the Member's
request.
