Council Member Julie Menin, Chair of the Committee on

Small Business, and I want to begin by welcoming my

Colleagues who have joined us here today. Majority

Whip Selvena Brooks-Powers, Council Member Ung, and

Council Member Tiffany Caban, and Council Member

Velazquez is on Zoom, and we've also been joined by

Council Member Althea Stevens who has a bill that

we're hearing today.

At today's hearing, the Committee will be voting on Intro. 686. This bill was previously heard in a joint hearing with the Committee of Youth Services. The bill, which is sponsored by Council

Member Stevens, would amend the Administrative Code
to enhance the opportunities available through the
Summer Youth Employment Program, very proud to be a
co-prime sponsor of this bill. I think this bill is
really going to make an enormous difference to ensure
that young people have opportunities both at City
agencies and in the private sector as well. Youth
unemployment often negatively affects future
employment, either by increasing the probability of
unemployment in adulthood or reducing access to
higher wages. New York City's Summer Youth Employment
Program shows the success that comes from engaging
and uplifting our City's youth and has grown to serve
over 90,000 participants this year, making it the
largest youth employment program in the country. The
power and interest in this program is clear and must
be utilized to its fullest potential to effectively
support New York City youth. Today, we are voting on
Council Member Stevens' bill, Intro. 686, which seeks
to diversify the opportunities available for
participants of the Summer Youth Employment Program
by requiring each City agency to have a goal of
accepting SYEP participants equal to at least 0.5
percent of its total full-time head count.

The bill also requires coordination

between the Department of Small Business Services and
the Department of Youth and Community Development to
promote SYEP to businesses in SBS' contacts.

Finally, the bill will require a report breaking down the SYEP placements in government, private, and not-for-profit sectors with additional breakdowns on the number of youth employed at each City agency.

The future of New York City depends on the support we provide our youth now, and I very much look forward to voting on Intro. 686.

I first of all want to thank Nicole Cata and Rebecca Barilla from Central Staff for their work putting together this hearing as well as my own Chief-of-Staff, Jonathan Szott, and Legislative Director, Brandon Jordan, for their assistance.

Now, it's my pleasure to turn it over to my Colleague, Council Member Stevens.
