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SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: This is a sound check for the Committee on Sanitation and Solid Waste

Management. Today's date is June 7, 2023. Being recorded by Danny Huang (phonetic) on the 14th Floor Hearing Room.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: All right. Welcome to the New York City Council Committee on Sanitation and Solid Waste Management vote.

Please silence all cell phones.

Chair, we're ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON NURSE: All right. [GAVEL]

Good afternoon, everyone. Welcome to the Committee on

Sanitation and Solid Waste Management. I'm excited to

be here with you all.

We're going to save all the big remarks for tomorrow, so we'll let you all get out of here, but just want to note that right now New York City is grappling with the worst air quality in the world because of climate-change-fueled forest fires burning hundreds of miles away in Canada, and we are watching the climate crisis in real-time, and we have to act. It feels really meaningful and significant to be voting on the Zero Waste Act now during this week, actually putting some kind of solution forward. This

COMMITTEE ON SANITATION AND SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT 3 is a major environmental justice victory for New York City and beyond, and it's a vital part of our ongoing efforts to build a more equitable and sustainable waste management system.

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Today, we are voting on five pieces of legislation starting with the two bills that I sponsored. I have Intro. 274A which establishes a goal of diverting recyclables and organic waste 100 percent by 2030 from landfills and incinerators.

Intro. 275 requires the New York City Department of Sanitation to annually report on the City's progress on achieving these zero waste goals.

It also includes bills from my partners,

Council Member Shahana Hanif and Keith Powers. Intro.

244A sponsored by Council Member Shahana Hanif

creates a mandatory citywide curbside organics

program for residential buildings with language
accessible outreach and education.

Intro. 280 sponsored by Council Member
Keith Powers establishes community recycling centers
and community recycling events.

Intro. 281B sponsored by Council Member Keith Powers requires organic waste drop-off sites and community composting facilities.

1 COMMITTEE ON SANITATION AND SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT 4 2 Together, these laws represent a 3 comprehensive sweeping approach to advancing zero 4 waste and tackling the over-11,000 tons of residential waste New Yorkers generate every single day. This Act is a landmark achievement for New York 6 7 City that advances sustainable waste management and tackles our climate crisis. 8 Now, I will turn it over to the Clerk to take the vote. 10 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: 11 12 Greetings, everyone. William Martin, Committee Clerk. Roll call vote Committee on Sanitation and Solid 13 14 Waste Management. All items are coupled. Chair Nurse. 15 CHAIRPERSON NURSE: I vote aye. 16 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Gennaro. 17 COUNCIL MEMBER GENNARO: Aye. 18 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Bottcher. 19 COUNCIL MEMBER BOTTCHER: I vote aye, and I want to commend Chair Nurse and Council Members 20 21 Hanif and Powers. I think what we're doing today is 2.2 so incredibly significant, and the great news, the 2.3 good news always doesn't make the biggest headlines, right, but what we're doing today by establishing a 24

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COMMITTEE ON SANITATION AND SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT 5 for New York City buildings, and establishing recycling centers in all neighborhoods, it's going to be transformative, and I'm really proud of this Committee and what we've done already in the last year and half and we're just getting started. Thank you.

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CHAIRPERSON NURSE: Clerk, can I interrupt? Sorry. I didn't realize we had Council Member Hanif online who wanted to make a statement. I turn it over to you.

COUNCIL MEMBER HANIF: Thank you so much.

I am just really overjoyed right now. Sorry that I'm not there in person. The air quality issues are a huge concern to my own health, and I hope that you all are practicing safe health measures to protect yourself.

What a huge, huge win for us. Thank you to Chair Nurse for including 244A on today's agenda and your incredible partnership on this bill over the past year plus. I want to express tons of gratitude to the co-prime sponsors who introduced this bill alongside me, Speaker Adams, Chair Nurse, Brooklyn Borough President Reynoso, Council Members Powers, Won, Bottcher, Gennaro, Menin, Hudson, Caban, Brewer,

COMMITTEE ON SANITATION AND SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT 6 and Rivera. I also want to thank so many other Council Members for signing on and bringing us to 42 sponsors. I also want to thank DSNY, CLA for their collaboration in moving this bill forward. The overwhelming support and leadership behind this bill really demonstrates that universal residential composting is a commonsense solution that will solidify New York City as an environmental justice leader and save our City money. Right now, we know that more than a third of all trash New Yorkers produce is organic waste. Currently, the vast majority of this waste is either incinerated, predominantly in communities of color, damaging their health, or it rots in landfill, emitting methane, a greenhouse gas 25 times more destructive than carbon dioxide, and this bill will create a citywide curbside composting program for residential buildings diverting organic waste to productive uses like nourishing our City's soil or heating our homes. The bill also requires the upcoming Solid Waste Management Plan to maximize the usable composting of this organic waste. Collections will be mandatory weekly and year-round, allowing us to reach the needed environmental impact to meet the climate

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COMMITTEE ON SANITATION AND SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT 7 1 crisis and the economic efficiencies that will help 2 3 the City financially. 4 I want to close by thanking the countless 5 advocates who have been instrumental in advancing this bill including TREEage, WE ACT, NRDC, 350BK, 6 7 Sunrise, NYCLV, and countless more. I want to thank my team, Alex Liao, Michael Whitesides, Nora 8 Brickner, Musarrat Lamia, and Hannah Henderson-Charnow, Annelle Hernandez from Chair Nurse's team, 10 11 Hayley Goldstein and Ben Jacobs from Council Member 12 Powers' team, and Brad Reed, Audrey Son, Ricky 13 Chawla, (INAUDIBLE), and Kris Sartori from the

Together with the passage of the other bills from the Zero Waste Act, passing Intro. 244A would mark a major step towards a truly green future for New York City. I encourage my Colleagues to vote yes. Thank you. Back to you, Chair.
