SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning and welcome to today's New York City Council vote for the Committee on Health.

At this time, please silence all electronic devices.

Chair Schulman, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON SCHULMAN: Good morning and welcome to this hearing of the City Council Committee on Health.

Today, the Committee will vote on several pieces of legislation, Proposed Introductions 96A and 325A sponsored by Council Member Brannon, Proposed Introduction 814A sponsored by Council Member Krishnan, Proposed Introduction 975A sponsored by myself, and Proposed Introduction 996A sponsored by Council Member Narcisse.

I want to welcome Members of the

Committee who are present today. Council Member

Narcisse, Council Member Hudson, Council Member

Menin, Council Member Ariola, and Council Member

Velazquez who is online.

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I am proud to say that all of the bills we are voting on this morning relate to increase access to healthcare in our communities in some form, whether it be by providing vision testing and eyeglasses to low-income New Yorkers, providing information on nearby pediatric emergency care in the City, reporting on the location of AEDs, increasing access to blood pressure machines, or providing information on free CPR courses.

I am proud to be the prime sponsor of
Introduction 975 which will require the Health
Department to maintain a list of free life-saving CPR
courses available to the public in New York City. The
more people we educate on how to use CPR, the more
lives we can potentially save.

In closing, I would like to ask if any of my Colleagues present would like to make a statement on their bills.

Council Member Narcisse.

COUNCIL MEMBER NARCISSE: Good morning.

Thank you, Chair. I don't want to say much about this because this is something that is affecting so many of us. Hypertension or blood pressure is a leading cause of death in New York City and nationally. The

condition is a major risk factor for cardiovascular
disease and, despite decades of research supporting
how a reduction in blood pressure can lower the risk
of stroke, heart attack, and heart failure, less than
half of adults in the United States with hypertension
have controlled blood pressure. Further, black adults
continue to be disproportionately affected by early
onset and higher prevalence of hypertension as well
as the health conditions that hypertension can cause
The bottom line is you control your blood pressure,
you control a lot of other diseases. I thank you,
Chair, for putting it on and hopefully, I pray that
all my Colleagues will vote on it because this is an
important thing that we can address in our community
by controlling our blood pressure. Thank you.
