SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: This is a sound check for the Committee on Parks and Recreation. Today's date is June 22, 2023. Being recorded by Danny Huong (phonetic) in the Committee Room.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning and welcome to the New York City Council vote of the Committee on Parks and Recreation.

At this time, can everyone please silence your cell phones? Thank you for your cooperation.

Chair, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON KRISHNAN: [GAVEL] Thank you so much, Sergeant.

Good morning, everyone. I am Shekar Krishnan, Chair of the Committee on Parks and Recreation.

Today, the Committee will vote on three pieces of legislation. First, Proposed Intro. 7-A sponsored by Council Member Ayala would require the City to make memberships for recreation centers free for young adults between 18 and 24 years old. This would help increase youth participation in rec center activities since young adults would no longer be required to pay the yearly 25-dollar fee. We first

2 considered this bill at a Parks Committee hearing on
3 March 1st of this year.

Second, Proposed Intro. 227-A is sponsored by Council Member Brewer. Currently, other than within the supportive documents we draft for each Local Law, there is no easily accessible biographical or background information for ceremonial street co-names or even official name changes that are posted on any City agency website. Intro. 227-A would improve this by requiring an agency or office designated by the Mayor to publish on its website biographical information pertaining to all street and park name changes. This bill was first considered at a Parks Committee hearing on June 7, 2022.

Finally, apropos, we'll consider a bill that would ceremonially co-name 112 thoroughfares and public places throughout the City. This bill was first considered by the Committee last week at a hearing on June 13th. Of the many honorees proposed by this piece of legislation, I'd like to call attention to a couple of co-namings that I am proud to have sponsored.

My first nomination is for Janet Kelly who was an important civic leader in my District. She

My other nomination is for Mike Crowly who was the founding member and President of the Jackson Heights Beautification Group. Under his leadership, JHBG helped to landmark Jackson Heights as a historic district. He was instrumental in so many other activities that helped to improve our community in so many ways, including establishing the first ever community-based anti-graffiti program in the city, the JHBG Architecture and Good Neighbor Awards, the JHBG Halloween Parade, the Garden Club, and created the Friends of Travers Park and a community newsletter that we still receive to this day.

Broadway across from Van Cortlandt Park, opened up a second location in Harlem, but what makes I think their store and their lives so incredible isn't just that they've made a successful store that really is well-known across the country, people come from all over to buy their delicious cakes, it really is that they were part of the fabric of the community, and they recognized that the business wasn't just about the business, it wasn't just about making good food, it was about the people that they served, and there wasn't a community event, a civic organization that they weren't involved in, doing work to uplift the entire community. mention Sylvia Lask. Sylvia Lask, the street co-
naming introduced by Council Member Velazquez. Sylvia
Lask I've known since I was zero. She was a friend of
my family long before I was born, and she was a
fierce advocate really, really close until the day
she died for mental health. Traveling up to Albany
day-in and day-out more than anyone would want to,
but she did because she knew fighting for mental
health and mental health education was critical to
the future of New York City. She was a fighter until
the very end, but she wasn't just about the big
issues like mental health. She never failed to give a
phone call when something great happened or something
tragic happened. Every single year, I would receive a
birthday call in the mail from her, and, when I had
kids, she subsequently sent them birthday cards every
single year, and so today we're voting on two very
well-deserved street co-namings.

With that, I vote aye.
