CHAIRPERSON JULIE MENIN: Good morning.

I am Council Member Julie Menin, Chair of the

Committee on Small Business and thank you for joining our hearing to vote on three bills including my bills, Proposed Introduction 263A and 1103A and

Council Member Narcisse's bill, Proposed Intro 969A.

I want to thank my Council colleagues for joining us here today. Access to capital financial literacy and a sustainable workforce are only some of the resources required by small business owners and entrepreneurs of New York City to run their businesses. Unfortunately, access to these resources can be difficult and small businesses would greatly benefit from support to ensure that they are directed to and receiving all resources available to them to

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start and sustain their small businesses. The bills we are voting today would reduce the barriers small business owners and entrepreneurs face when navigating the business landscape with the support and engagement of the department of small business services. These bills would support Workforce Development, increase equitable access to financial services and provide enhanced banking assistance. My bill proposed Intro 263A would require SBS to produce an annual report on the services provided at each workforce 1 center in the city including the number of new registrants, the number of job placements and the number of registrants provided job training. This Bill would provide transparency at workforce 1 centers to ensure that we are meeting the needs of applicants and improve these services if necessary. My second bill, proposed Intro 1103A would require SBS to provide information on selecting a bank for small businesses including information on specialized services offered by banks for small business, info on typical fees, interest rates, monthly charges or balance requirements. The benefits of having accounts at multiple banks and very importantly information about federal deposit insurance

2	corporation and other protections provided to small
3	business which couldn't be more important in light of
4	the bank failures that we saw earlier in the year.
5	Intro 929 from Council Member Narcisse requires the
6	SBS to create a directory of local community
7	development financial institutions or SDFIs with
8	information about the services they provide and the
9	communities that they serve. I am grateful to
10	Council Member Narcisse who is also here today to
11	speak about her bill for introducing this
12	legislation. I look forward to the vote on the Bills
13	and I look forward to the support that they will
14	bring to New York City small businesses. Lastly, I
15	want to thank Jessica Boulet (phonetic) and Rebecca
16	Barilla (phonetic) from central staff or their work
17	putting together this hearing as well as my own
18	Chief of Staff, Jonathan Szott, my Legislative
19	Director Brandon Jordan and Legislative Aide John
20	Mendez for their assistance. I am now going to turn
21	it over to Council Member Narcisse to make a
22	statement about her Bill.

MERCEDES NARCISSE: Thank you Chair. I am honored privileged to be here as a former business woman in New York City. How difficult that is and

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thank you for the opportunity to bring my bill up. As our City arises from the challenges of COVID 19 pandemic, we spin at a pivotal moment. We have the profound obligation to reinvigorate the very heartbeat of our City, our small businesses. 969A is not just an amendment but a testament to our unwavering commitment. It is a commitment to ensure that as we rebuilt every entrepreneur, every local store and every innovative start-up has the foundation and support they so rightly deserve. counting on my colleague support because it is imperative more than ever to support the small businesses as we refer is the backbone of our community. As we see the statistics of the 36 stated FI only 10 to 12 provide a minimum of 50 loans per year and the maximum number of loans provided by the more active institution is under 350 per year. this bill, we are going to make sure all the business owners, the small business owners in our community is aware of the opportunity that CDFI is committed to do and provided. Thank you.
