Each year, about 365 million tons of cargo enters, leaves, or passes through New York City with about 89 percent of it being carried by a truck. By 2045, the tonnage of cargo is expected to increase to 540 million tons with the same proportion of it

I believe Proposed Intro. number 906-A is that solution. The proposed bill would require the City to identify at least three locations where offstreet parking for tractor-trailers and other
