Resolution number 580 calling on the City University of New York to ensure that all campuses award an appropriate number of college credits to students who earned a New York State Seal of Biliteracy in high school and, where required, accept the Seal as fulfillment of any foreign language requirement. This legislation was previously heard at a joint hearing of the Committee on Higher Education and the Committee on Education on October 18, 2023, along with its companion Resolution number 579 calling on

the New York City Department of Education to ensure that New York State Seal of Biliteracy is awarded in all New York City public high schools to eligible students. I am proud to have introduced these two resolutions which are based on research and advocacy done by two Hunter College students, Adriadna Pavlides-Sanchez and Isabella Grullon, whom I mentored earlier this year. These resolutions are to their credit, and it my hope that these two resolutions together will give a head start in college to many of our New York City students who are proficient in world languages, often their first languages, in addition to English when they leave high school and enter CUNY. We want those students to be awarded college credits for their world language proficiencies. That's a win/win/win/win for all of us.
