Boards additional flexibility during their summer

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months.

much, Chair Brooks-Powers. I especially just want to take a moment to express my gratitude to you for your support of this legislation and for helping to navigate it through the Council. We wouldn't be here today without your leadership and support, and I really appreciate it.

I also want to thank Borough President
Reynoso who had introduced an earlier draft of this
bill in the previous Council, Legislative Counsel
Mark Chen, many folks here at the Council including
my Chief-of-Staff, Molly Haley, who worked tirelessly
on this and advocates from across the city who have
expressed strong support.

It's worth noting that 2023 is on track to be the deadliest year for cyclists in New York City in decades. Crashes have killed 26 cyclists in the first nine months of this year, and

COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE overwhelmingly, almost 95 percent of those deaths have occurred on streets where we lack protected bike lanes. This legislation will help us get back on track with the Master Streets Plan. We are required to build 250 miles of protected bike lanes by 2025, but we've only installed 35 so far. We're behind because DOT has a process that requires months of dead periods after Community Board presentations. It doesn't make sense. No other transportation project in New York City, no bus lane or otherwise, requires this type of extended dead periods where we cannot move forward on projects that are supported by our communities. I am really supportive of each of the Members of this Committee who are voting for the bill today and appreciate the really thoughtful dialogue that Council Members who disagree with the bill have had with me over the last number of months. This legislation will help increase safety on our streets, it will reduce dependence on cars, and it will ensure a more streamlined and responsible government process moving forward, and I really want to thank everybody who's supporting it again.
