SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning, and welcome to today's New York City Council hearing for the Committee on Finance.

Chair, we're ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: [GAVEL] Okay. Good morning, and welcome to today's Finance Committee meeting. I'm Council Member Justin Brannon. I Chair the Committee on Finance. We've been joined this morning by Council Members Louis, Brooks-Powers, De La Rosa, Ayala, Sanchez, Restler, Brewer, Hudson, Carr, Williams, Ossé, and Farías, and on Zoom by Council Members Stevens and Moya.

Today, the Committee will be voting on four items. A property tax exemption resolution, a transparency resolution, Intro. 898, and Intro. 906.

The first, the property tax exemption resolution is a new 40-year Article XI for four

buildings in Council Member De La Rosa's District. As part of the exemption, the buildings will enter into an HPD regulatory agreement restricting rents and setting aside 96 units for formerly homeless tenants as well as requiring completion of identified immediate and short-term repairs. HPD's Aging in Place initiative upgrades will also be implemented as part of that agreement.

Next, a transparency resolution, which sets forth the new designation and changes in the designation of certain organizations receiving local aging and youth discretionary funding and funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the budget. As with all transparency resolutions, Council Members will have to sign a disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any of the groups on the attached list. If any Council Member has a potential conflict of interest with any of the organizations listed, they have the opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time of their vote. As a reminder, please disclose any conflicts you may have with proposed subcontractors used by organizations sponsored by discretionary funding. These disclosures must be made before the subcontractor can be

approved. Disclosure forms must be completed and submitted prior to the vote on the transparency resolution and may be emailed to Everton Smith, who

5 is also present with us in the chamber today.

Finally, both Intros on the agenda relate to business improvement districts. Intro. 898, sponsored by Council Member Nurse, would establish the Cypress Hills Fulton Business Improvement District with a proposed first year budget of 400,000 dollars, and Intro. 906, sponsored by Council Member Won, would expand the boundaries of the existing Queens Plaza Court Square Business Improvement District to incorporate two sub-districts and rename the expanded bid to the Long Island City Business Improvement District. The expanded bid would have a proposed first year budget of 2,058,978 dollars. Both bills were heard on June 20th, after which they were laid aside for the required 30-day period to allow for any property owner in the proposed extended area to object the bill with the City Clerk.

We've been joined by representatives from the Department of Small Business Services who will testify on the objection period. I'll now turn the

the following parties: To each of the owners of real property within the proposed district at the address shown on the latest City assessment roll; to such other persons as are registered with the City to receive tax bills concerning real property within a district; and to tenants of each building within the proposed district, and arrange publication of a copy of the resolution at least once in a local newspaper.

At the conclusion of the objection period at 5 p.m. on July 22nd, 2024, and taken into consideration any objections postmarked by that date, one valid objection representing less than 1 percent of the total assessed value of each proposed district was filed with the City Clerk for properties in the district. This level of objection is within our acceptable threshold needed to advance the bill for a favorable consideration by the full City Council.

The Department of Small Business Services supports the establishment of the proposed Cypress Hills Fulton Street bid and the expansion of the Long Island City bid. In our judgment, efforts will improve the quality of life and the business conditions in Cypress Hills as well as the Long
