CHAIRPERSON LANCMAN: Good morning everyone. Good morning and welcome to the first meeting of the New York City Council Committee on Rules, Privileges and Elections. I don't think there are any other members who are not on the committee with us today. I'd also like to acknowledge the Rules Committee Council, Elizabeth Guzman who's work in producing the reports that we're going to be

To, today the committee is considering proposed amendments to the rules of the council regarding officers, committee chairs and members and proposed appointments to the committees and subcommittees of the council of the city of New York. resolution Number One designates the titles and describes the extent... the extent, extent and amended committees and subcommittees. The resolution recommends that such committees and subcommittees bear the titles and descriptions as set forth in the papers before you. The committee will also commit... consider amendments to ex-officio officers and the scheduling of future committee meetings. These amendments are also set forth in Resolution One. In addition, the committee will consider approving Committee Chair appointments and membership assignment, designated officers of the council and the creation of new committees and subcommittees. These proposed committee changes are set forth as presented in the papers before you as well. I would like to say thank you to the leadership of the speaker and his team in putting together these amendments, appointments, and assignments and thank

you to the Office of the General Council and

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Speaker Corey Johnson.

SPEAKER JOHNSON: Thank you Chair Lancman, temporary though as it may be. I'm thrilled to be here today on our first official Council Hearing of the new year as we convene to discuss the leadership of this body. Over the last week I have been honored to meet with each and every one of my colleagues to discuss their vision for this council over the next four years. As we spoke as we have many, many times before in the last months to say nothing of the last four years about how to most effectively harness the authority of the city council to best serve New Yorkers one thing became abundantly clear, our members are strong, our members are diverse and our members are talented and collectively whether we grew up in public housing or raised by a single parent or immigrated from another country or left college early our backgrounds reflect the myriad of experiences of the 8.2 million people who call New York City home. And though we may come from different walks of life the common thread that binds us

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leadership in the budget negotiating team, I have really worked hard to be as inclusive as possible to every single member, I've tried to be creative, I've tried to be strategic, I've tried to be thoughtful in identifying new areas that folks could work on, issues and committees that were not created in the past because as I said at the Charter Meeting and as I said to my colleagues leading up to the charter meeting I want everyone to be able to do work here at City Hall that they're interested in and will impact the city and that will help their districts and so not everyone of course got exactly what they wanted but I was as flexible as humanly possible to try to make everyone happy and to be able to work on things that would interest them. I think you'll see that in this document and you will see that when we talk about leadership and we talk about the budget negotiating team and we talk about other opportunities. This is a council where every single member is going to be respected whether you supported me or not you are going to be respected. If you look at this document... someone's going to kick me for saying this but it's true, there was no

vindictiveness, there wasn't, none, zero. I tried to

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help as many people as possible and I look forward to continuing to do that, we did this in a week which was very hard to compile this in a week in meeting with members, putting it all into a matrix, continuing to have conversations, this may... this document may not be perfect, it may need to be adjusted at some point, I hope it doesn't have to be but it may have to be because I want to continue to respect every single member and to ensure that they can work on issues that matter to them and that are going to help their communities.
