5	Introduction Number 262 sponsored by Council Member							
6	Richards pursuant to Local Law 27 which was passed							
7	through this committee in 2015. The DOE is required							
8	to report on data regarding its provision of special							
9	education services including the number of students							
10	enrolled who have an individualized education program							
11	or IEP. Although Local Law 27 requires the DOE to							
12	disaggregate enrollment information by district							
13	eligibility for the free and reduced-price lunch							
14	program, race, ethnicity, gender, English language							
15	learner status, recommended language of instruction,							
16	grade level and disability classification it does not							
17	currently require school level data. Intro 262 would							
18	amend Local Law 27 to 2015 to require the DOE to							
19	report on the number of students enrolled who have an							
20	individualized education plan disaggregated by							
21	school. This bill will increase transparency							
22	regarding special education and I strongly support							
23	passage of this bill and I commend my colleague							
24	Council Member Richards and I want to thank the							
25	extraordinary, extraordinary committee staff Millie
