AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to the creation of a school-based teen dating violence prevention program

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. The public health law is amended by adding a new section 25 2 to read as follows:
 - § 25. School-based teen dating violence prevention program. 1. The commissioner, in cooperation with the commissioner of education, and county boards of cooperative extension, shall encourage the establishment of a school-based teen dating violence prevention program as provided in subdivision two of this section.

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- 2. The program shall be designed to be incorporated into a school district's existing health curriculum to prevent and reduce the incidence and prevalence of teen dating violence. The program shall use recommendations and goals of the New York state coalition against domestic violence, or its successor, and local community providers in developing and implementing guidelines relating to education, strategies and responses to teen dating violence for students in kindergarten through twelfth grade to prevent, deter and address incidents of teen dating violence.

 3 identification and examination of ideas about healthy relationships and
 4 behaviors learned from the home, family and the media; (ii) self-esteem
 5 and self-worth; and (iii) friendship and empathy;

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1 (c) For students in fifth grade through twelfth grade: (i) a defi2 nition of teen dating violence; (ii) recognition of warning signs exhib3 ited by a dating partner; (iii) characteristics of a healthy relation4 ship; (iv) links between bullying and teen dating violence; (v) safe use
5 of technology; (vi) safe and appropriate bystander skills and behaviors;
6 (vii) a discussion of local community resources for those in a teen
7 dating violence relationship; and (viii) an overview of the school's
8 policies and procedures on teen dating violence;

- (d) Training programs for teachers, administrators, nurses, and mental health staff from kindergarten through twelfth grade, which shall include, but not be limited to, basic principles of dating violence, risk factors and warning signs of dating violence and technological dating abuse;
- (e) Designation of at least one person as a prevention liaison who is responsible for coordinating all teen dating violence and healthy relationship initiatives. The prevention liaison shall receive training on teen dating violence as required by the commissioner. The name and contact information of the prevention liaison will be published on the school district's website and in the school district's policies and procedures on teen dating violence;
- 21 (f) Developing a response program to incidents of teen dating violence 22 and healthy relationship initiatives, which will include monitoring and 23 reporting components;
 - (g) Adopting a policy which shall include, but not be limited to, a definition of dating violence, a statement that teen dating violence will not be tolerated, guidelines for responding to incidents of dating violence.
 - 4. For the purposes of this section:
 - (a) "teen dating violence" means a pattern of power and control in which one dating partner uses threats of and/or actually engages in emotional, verbal, physical, sexual, financial and/or spiritual abuse in order to harm, coerce, threaten, intimidate, control and/or isolate another dating partner in a relationship of a romantic or intimate nature.
 - (b) "dating partner" means any person regardless of gender involved in an actual or perceived intimate relationship with another, regardless of whether the relationship is continuing, former, casual, serious, or long-term or the number of interactions between the individuals involved.
- 40 (c) "threat" shall include those made through electronic means includ-41 ing social media, text message, phone, email, and/or the internet.
- 5. The commissioner may administer directly or through contract, with in the amount of funds allocated and within amounts appropriated, the teen dating violence prevention program.
