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3 CHAIRPERSON CABRERA: Alrighty. [gavel] 4 Good afternoon and welcome to this hearing of the 5 Committee on Government Operations. I'm Council 6 Member Fernand Cabrera, and we've been joined by Council Member Kallos, Council Member Yeger, Council 8 Powers, and Council Member Perkins. Today we are holding a hearing and vote on six resolutions all 10 related to election and campaign finance reform in 11 New York State. First, we have Resolution 307 12 sponsored by myself calling upon the New York State 13 Legislature to pass and the Governor to sign 14 legislation that would authorize same day voter 15 registration in New York, which will allow eligible 16 residents to register to vote and cast a ballot at a 17 pole site on Election Day. Too often, people may be 18 unaware that they are not currently registered to 19 vote, yet feel strongly enough about an election to 20 want to come into a poll site to participate in 21 democracy. We should be encouraging people to vote 22 not discouraging them from doing so simply because 23 paperwork was not submitted in time. Same day 24 registration will fix this situation. Second, we 25 have a Preconsidered Resolution sponsored by myself

In New York City we represent 85,000 Bedford-Stuyvesants working who keep our city residential buildings, schools, offices, stations, and neighborhoods clean and safe. We proudly fight

CHAIRPERSON CABRERA: Absolutely.

COUNCIL MEMBER YEGER: Thank you. Mr. Chairman, I join you and my colleagues in congratulating Council Member Kallos, Council Member Powers and, of course, yourself, Mr. Chairman for your commitment to democracy. While I support many of these bills, many of these resolutions, and the bills to-of which they are subject in Albany, with respect to one particular resolution, I am not able to vote in favor, and I wish to explain why. would be Resolution with the Temporary Assignment Number of T2018-1885 by good friend and very wise colleague Council Member Kallos, and I-while I support part of the resolution, I do not support in its entirety. I support Council Member Levine's Bill A960-AB, which would provide registered voters with seven days of early voting. I think early voting is important in our democracy. I think it gives us an opportunity to get people out who can't otherwise show up on Election Day during the 15 hours that polls are open. However, I cannot support Bill A7623 and the Senate Bill 840, which would provide for no

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excuse absentee ballot voting. I believe that our democracy is important enough that it should not become the functional equivalent of owning stock in Kellogg's where we get a mail-in ballot. We send it in. We call it day. We walk away, and I'm also concerned about the incidents and the potential instances of fraud in my great Borough of Brooklyn where everything is always perfect except for this little part that I'm going to describe. We a have seen elections where unscrupulous people engage in in absentee ballot fraud, which in my view and the view of many people involved in litigation about this, cost elections to the Democrats, and I think that that's something that we should be very vigilant about. Now, I'm not one of those people who believe that people should be forced to show ID at a pole because of this, you know, alleged fraud. believe in that. I don't think it's true. think it's demonstrable, and it's never really something that's affected elections, but I think when open up the paper ballot and the mail-the mail-in ballot to allow where anybody can kind of walk around with a clip board and sign people up to receive ballots by mail, send them in and there's no real
