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CHAIRPERSON COHEN: Alright. Good morning and welcome to today's hearing. My name is Andrew Cohen and I am the Chair of the State and Federal Legislation Committee. On today's agenda we will be considering four state legislative resolutions. First, I'd like to introduce the committee members who are here, Council Member Rafael Espinal and Councilman Karen Koslowitz. I'm going to turn the page onto this side. The first State Legislative resolution this committee will be considering and voting on today is Senate Bill 7780, and Assembly Bill A.9943. This bill is an act relating to granting retroactive eligibility to apply for enhanced Tier 3 status to the family of former New York City Police Officer Mark Rivera who died of a heart attack on March 21, 2015 at the age of 37. Just for everybody's clarification, this is-we allowed other people to apply for these benefits last year because Officer Rivera died before we passed that bill, we're going to pass this bill to right [coughs] The second State Legislative resolution is Senate Bill S.8497 and Assembly Bill 10696 an act to amend the retirement and Social

COMMITTEE ON STATE AND FEDERAL LEGISLATION Security Law in relation to the definition of additional member contributions and basic member contributions for certain New York City employees, retirement system members who are subject to certain retirement plans under Articles 14 and 15 of the Retirement and Social Security Law to allow such additional member contributions to be used to offset a deficit of basic member contributions or to allow an excess of basic member contributions to offset a deficit of additional member contributions upon retirement. The third [coughs] State Legislative Resolution this committee will be considering and voting on today is Senate Bill S.8941 and Assembly Bill 11123, which would amend the Real Property Tax Law by adjusting the State Board of Real Property Services Class Equalization Rule for one year only to cap the maximum class growth at half a percent for New York City. This formula is used to determine the tax rates for each of the four property classes. effect of this change would be to reduce the amount by which the current base proportions for any class including Classes 1, 2 and 3-family homes is allowed to grow, resulting in citywide saving of about \$270--\$272 for a typical owner of a Class 1 single-family

2	home. If it does not pass, the Council must adopt a
3	Default SBRPS formula and tax rates for Class 1
4	residential homes, which would rise to 7%. The final
5	bill is Senate Bill S.6044-C and Assembly Bill
6	Assembly Bill A.7798-C. This bill seeks to amend the
7	Vehicle and Traffic Law in relation to expanding the
8	School Speed Safety Program by increasing the cap to
9	290 schools from the current cap of 140 schools. The
10	purpose of this-of the expansion is to cover more
11	children and increase safety. At this moment, I
12	would like to open the hearing to any of our
