been a long few weeks but we made it. We now
officially have a budget.

[applause]

SPEAKER JOHNSON: I am incredibly proud of this budget that we have worked on so diligently and we all did it together. Literally all 51 members worked on this budget together for something for every neighborhood across the City, every Council District, every Borough, we worked to try to get some really good things in this budget. With this budget we are strengthening our City's social safety net for the poorest New Yorkers and making an impact on all of those who need it most. We identified priorities across the five boroughs and through a united front, we negotiated with the administration. We stuck together and now we have a budget that will benefit everyone in this City. We wanted to focus on the big picture and some of our significant achievements in this budget are exactly that. There is so much in this budget to be proud of, especially fair fares, increased budget reserves, school accessibility for disabled children, a significant increase in fair student funding and an increased number of units year to year on permanent supportive housing. With this

budget, we also wanted to send a message to all New Yorkers. We are listening to you. One signature piece of this budget of course is fair fares. are nearly 800,000 New Yorkers living at or below the federal poverty line who will be eligible for this program. Now working mothers like Shanee Raaman [phonetic] who I've talked a lot about will be able to take their kids to school, without worry, get the chills saying it, without worrying about begging for a swipe. The \$106 million included for the fiscal 2019 budget and the commitment by the De Blasio administration to continue to fully fund the program in the out years will literally open turnstiles and doors to the neediest residents of our great city. Another signature piece of this budget is school accessibility. Listening to mothers like Rebecca Coschenco [phonetic] who testified here at the Council, tell her story of carrying her daughter up the stairs of PS321 in Brooklyn to get her to computer class proved to me that we have a long way to go and that we have to act and act now. Access should not be limited to children because they are different or disabled. What we are doing now is adding \$150 million in capital funding to increase

accessibility for disabled children in our City
schools. That is responsive government and it is one
that I am proud to be part of. We are doing the
right thing. These amazing New Yorkers are why we do
what we do. It is because of days like today that
remind me why I entered politics that when we
accomplish something of this magnitude by making a
difference in so many New Yorkers lives, this is what
makes it all worth it and I know that each and every
one of you in this body feel the same way. You have
been fantastic partners throughout this entire
process. Thank you all for being great colleagues
and for being great friends. I especially want to
thank the Chair of the City Council's Finance
Committee, Danny Dromm. Where is Danny?

We got excess appropriations taken out to actually accurately portray what our capital spending is, not in a front loaded way but in an accurate way and Vanessa spent countless and countless hours from the moment we started this new session on January 3 and I really want to thank her for her leadership and both of them for their hard work over these past few months on making this happen. The Council's Finance Team also deserves a huge thank you for their tireless work.

I want to highlight a few other things that I think are important for us and there are many, many great things in this budget but there are a few things that I want to just recognize that we all should be very, very proud of. We have been planting seeds in this budget for tomorrow by helping young people and where is the Chair of our Youth Services Committee, Debbie Rose?

She's sitting right here in front of me. She has been relentless, tireless, incredible throughout this entire process, on the outside game, on the steps of City Hall in meeting with advocates and on the inside yelling and screaming at BNT about young people. A pain in the neck in a good way because we got results, we got For Compass [phonetic] which is gonna help elementary school after school programs across the city, \$14.2 million.

SPEAKER JOHNSON: We restored \$15 million for 22,800 slots for summer programs for students in middle school citywide. We increased the Council's deep and long commitment especially from the black, Latino and Asian caucus on summer youth employment, getting an additional \$10.3 million to increase available jobs for young people this summer to 75,000 jobs plus an increase in the minimum wage for those folks in the program. We restored \$19 million for the Work, Learn, Grow Jobs Program for this next year providing in-school career readiness training and paid employment opportunities to teens and young adults year round. That is a lot of good stuff for the young people of New York City. We got some great

Congratulations, We, \$12.3 million to create the number of Carlos. parks maintenance works extending the open period for city pools and beaches and financing tree stump removal. I want to thank Chair Grodenchik and former chair of the Parks Committee, Mark Levine for their leadership on this. Jimmy Van Bramer, \$60 million in new library capital funds and \$16.7 million in additional new funding for city libraries, all three systems, more than what the library systems actually ask for. We got them more than that and so I'm really glad for that. We got an additional \$3.5 million for extra sanitation services across the city where there is a high need and we strengthened the social safety net. Besides the money that the city is going to have to put forward for significant NYCHA repairs in the future, we got \$40 million in

increased infrastructure funding for NYCHA. We
increased the number of supportive housing and I want
to thank Chair Ampry-Samuel for her amazing work

SPEAKER JOHNSON: On public housing throughout this entire, entire process. supportive housing we got an increase of permanent supportive housing units. Previously the commitment was 500 units a year. We moved that up to 700 units a year and we're gonna get it done more quickly and we are getting a very big building in Steve Levin's district that is gonna provide a significant number of new supportive housing units for the homeless individuals across New York City who've had such a hard time. I want to thank Steve for his leadership on this. Runaway Homeless Youth, \$3 million to create 60 new shelter beds for young LGBT folks from the ages of 21 to 24 years old, Ritchie Torres, Vanessa Gibson, Rafael Salamanca, Steve Levin, Danny Dromm and the LGBT Caucus deserve credit on that.

SPEAKER JOHNSON: The emergency food assistance program, the highest number ever for EFAB, feeding hungry New Yorkers in food pantries that are

not in the network, for the food bank of New York
City, for city harvest, we know that in the
wealthiest city in the United States of America, too
many people are still going hungry in our city and
this money is gonna help feed so many New Yorkers. I
am so proud of this funding getting at base line,
getting an increase, the Council investing on our own
side and this has been a labor of love between Barry
Grodenchik and Steve Levin and I am really proud of
them for this.

SPEAKER JOHNSON: Senior affordable housing, we got a \$500 million commitment for senior affordable housing target into four HPD development sites and 2 NYCHA sites through the city. This is an issue that East Brooklyn Congregations and Metro IF have been organizing around for years. The entire BLAC deserves a lot of credit on this and I want to thank them for their leadership

SPEAKER JOHNSON: So this is a good budget and it's a budget that everyone should feel proud of and should feel good about. I didn't go through everything. I'm sure many members are gonna

Back here at 6 o'clock in the morning being responsive to every member of this body on everything that matters to them and their

districts. He has the respect, I believe of every
member of this body, of all of the former Speakers
that he's served under, and of all the former Council
Members that he helped throughout the years and
because he has the respect and gratitude of all of
us, he should have the respect and gratitude of all
8.6 million New Yorkers because he has delivered on
behalf of every neighborhood of this city, on every
Council district of his city, on every borough in
this city. He has been someone who has told me
things I haven't wanted to hear, but he's done it in
a completely professional way. I am still in a total
state of denial. Literally, it's hard to even talk
about this and so I am very grateful. Before we give
