CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: Alright, alright. Good morning everyone. [background comments] Good morning everyone and welcome to the Committee on Land Use. I am Council Member Rafael Salamanca, Chair of this Committee. I want to welcome my colleagues who are members of this committee and are present today. We have Council Members Gibson, Barron, Constantinides, Lancman, Levin, Reynoso, Richards, Torres, Treyger, Grodenchik, Chair Adams, Diaz, Chair Moya and Rivera-[background comment] and Deutsch. want to thank Chair Moya and Chair Adams and Acting Chair Deutsch for their work on our Land Use Subcommittees. Today, we'll be voting on a number of items referred out of our subcommittees. We'll be voting to approve LU 143, the Application by Vida Mexicana doing business as Papacito for a revocable consent to operate a sidewalk café at 223 Dyckman Street in Council Member Rodriguez's district in Manhattan. We'll be voting to approve LUs 154, the application to designate the Coney Island Riegelmann Boardwalk in Council Member Treyger's district as a scenic landmark. Congratulations Council Member

Treyger. [cheers/applause] The designation consists 2 of the boardwalk extending from West 37th Street in 3 Coney Island to Brighton 15th Street in Brighton 4 Beach including the Beach Front Boardwalk a structure 5 walkway, comfort station, railing, beaches, light 6 7 fixtures steps and ramps to the beach. Steeplechase Pier and the beach beneath the boardwalk extending 8 from the north edge of the Boardwalk southerly 9 approximately 100 feet into the beach. 10 The Coney Island Boardwalk is one of the best known waterfronts 11 12 in the world, and has given people of all economic and social background access to the beach since 1923. 13 We'll be voting to approve LUs 158 the MHP Hope Homes 14 15 Cluster Amendment for property in Council Member Perkins' and Ayala's district. This amendment to a 16 previously approved application is necessary to 17 18 correct an error in the resolution, the exemption area was identified as one property comprised of 19 20 Block 1750, Lots 57 and 58. The correction is to identify each property separately as Block 1750, Lot 21 2.2 57 and Block 1750, Lot 58. We'll be voting to 23 approve LU 159 the East 90-the 490 East 181st Street application for property located in Council Member 24 Torres' district in the Bronx. HPD seeks approval of 25

2	the new Article XI Tax Exemption for a period of 40
3	years pursuant to Section 577 of the Private Housing
4	Finance Law. The subject property is existing—is an
5	existing 24-unit residential cooperative building for
6	low-income households with 23 occupied and one vacant
7	unit. The prior tax exemption will be terminated.
8	We'll be voting to approve LU 160 the 1130 Franklin
9	Avenue Tax Exemption Application for property located
10	in Council Member Gibson's district in the Bronx.
11	HPD seeks approval of a 40-year—of a new 40-year
12	Article XI tax exemption for an existing 20-unit co-
13	op low-income families with 14-occupied and six
14	vacants-vacant units. The prior tax exemptions will
15	be terminated. We'll be voting to approve LUs 161,
16	the small homes. We have NYCHA SQVH plus the two
17	amendments for property in Council Member Adams'
18	district. This amendment to a previously approved
19	application is necessary to correct an error in the
20	resolutions. In this case, part of the project area
21	was identified as 147-06 Sutter Place. The
22	correction is identified as 147-06 Sutter Avenue. We
23	will be voting to approve Preconsidered LU Friendset
24	Apartments for property located at 2911 West 36 th
25	Street in Council Member Trever's District in

Brooklyn. HPD seeks a partial Article XI tax
exemption for a period of 30 years for an existing
259-unit building. The prior tax exemption will be
terminated. Are there any questions or remarks from
members of the committee? Council Member Treyger.

Prior to the boardwalk being constructed, that beach was-was owned by private entities that did not allow all people to There is segregation based on, you know, people of color cannot enter certain amenities. Jews cannot enter at certain hotels. So, when the city purchased that land and at the turn of the 20th Century, constructed that boardwalk, it was a symbol of integration and accessibility for all people regardless of the color of your skin, the faith that you believe in, where you're from, what language you speak, how much money you have, this treasure, this public treasure is for all, and I am just so proud that finally we are joining the rants of Central Park, Prospect Park. Southern Brooklyn has a beautiful jewel as well, the Coney Island Boardwalk. So, I thank my colleagues. I ask them please to support this. The council has been so supportive from the beginning. We have unanimous support in the resolution. So, I just-I just ask my colleagues to please support this. Let's make the Coney Island
