CHAIRPERSON ESPINAL: Good morning. My name is Rafael Espinal. I am the Chair of the Consumer Affairs Committee. I'm joined today by other members of the Committee. We have Karen Koslowitz from Queens. We have Margaret Chin from Manhattan. We have Peter Koo from Queens. Today the committee will vote on Proposed Intro 965-A, a bill I sponsored that will address the administrative issue for tobacco retail licenses. Last year changes were made to the licensing for tobacco retailers. Previously, only sellers of cigarettes required licenses, but as the city continues its push to reduce the harms of smoking, we passed a bill to change the licensing requirements for tobacco retailers. The rollout of the changes meant a new application process for some small businesses that were unaware of the process. Intro 965-A will address some of the administrative issues that arose after these changes were put in place. The bill creates a time extension that would permit preexisting tobacco retailers to continue the license registration process with the city. The Council
