3 CHAIRPERSON RODRIGUEZ: Good morning 4 everyone who come to tis hearing, this hearing of the 5 City Council transportation Committee. I am Ydanis 6 Rodriguez, the Chair of this Committee. First, let 7 me recognize my colleagues who are here with us 8 today: Council Member Cabrera, Deutsch, Espinal, Koo, Menchaca, Salamanca, Diaz and Richards. Today 10 we will be voting on two bills and every solution 11 relation to the L Train shutdown. Starting April 12 2019, there will be no L Train service between 13 Brooklyn and Manhattan for 15 months, and the city 14 needs to be prepared. I am proud to be a co-sponsor 15 of the two bills both introduced together with 16 Speaker Corey Johnson. The first, Proposed Intro 17 989-A will require the Department of Transportation 18 in coordination with the MTA to designate at least 19 one community information center in each of 20 Manhattan, the Manhattan and Brooklyn-and Brooklyn 21 during the L Train shutdown. The community 2.2 information centers will provide resources and 23 information to members of the public regarding the 24 reconstruction and the city and the MTA's alternative 25 transportation options. The second bill is Proposed

Intro 990-A, which will require the Department of
Transportation to have an ambudsperson for the length
of the L Train shutdown. This ombudsperson will be
tasked with receiving and investigating complaints
and comments in connection with shut—the shutdown,
and would give the public clarity in knowing where
turn with their concerns during the 15-month
shutdown. We will also be voting on Resolution No.
377 introduced by my colleague Council Member Rafae
Espinal urging the governor and the MTA to commit to
quickly transition to an electric bus fleet and to
use electric buses as a robust part of the
replacement plan during the upcoming L Train
shutdown. I would also like to recognize Council
Member Costa Constantinides. I would like to thank
Speaker Johnson for his support and leadership on
these bills. I now call for the vote on Proposed
Intros 989-A and 990-A and Resolution 377. I
recommend a yes vote, and I ask the Committee Clerk
to please call the roll.

that have the worst air quality that the city has to

offer, and that's North Brooklyn and Lower Manhattan.

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I think now more than ever it's important that we
address the issues of air quality, climate change and
transitioning to an electric bus fleet is the right
way forward. Yes, they've committed to purchasing
ten buses, and starting a pilot program, but this is
a pilot program that's going to go on for three years
while the L Train shuts down a few months from today.
So, 200 diesel buses is not the best way to move
forward. We have to make sure there's a robust plan
to introduce electric buses and this opportunity.
Other cities, other countries had done it, and it's
time for us to get with the times, and making sure
we're doing our part, and we have to remember that
the reason the L Train is being shut down is because
of Hurricane Sandy, a hurricane that we look back on
and can—and can point to climate change as being the
reason that that occurred here in New York City. So,
we must urge the governor, urge the MTA that now more
than ever we have to make this transition. Thank
you.
