MOHAMMAD ARSHAD: Test, test, this is a Committee Hearing on Standards and Ethics.

Today's date is September 26, 2018 being recorded by Mohammad Arshad. (long silence).

UNIDENTIFIED: Quiet down, quiet down. (gavel pounding).

CHAIR STEVE MATTEO: Good morning. Today the Committee on Standards and Ethics will be holding a second hearing and a vote for Proposed Intro 735A that I am sponsoring in relation to the Advisory Opinions of the Conflicts of Interest Board and to repeal paragraph IV of the subdivision C of section 2603 in relation thereto. Uhm before I go on I just want to recognize the members that are here. We are Karen Koslowitz, Steve Levin, Margaret Chin and Vanessa Gibson and we have Donovan and Costa just hanging out on our values today. Uhm as we discussed in our first hearing on this Bill, the Conflicts of Interest Board has two powers relevant to this Bill; the power to issue rules and the power to issue advisor opinions. Under the City Charter, when interpreting the Conflicts of Interest Law generally or applying an interpretation broadly a rule must be issued. When applying the Conflicts of Interest Law

to the specific situation of one person an advisory opinion can be used, yet for at least the past decade these powers have seemingly not been used in this Instead the Board has tilted heavily toward the use of advisor opinions and the almost complete disuse of rules even when rule making would be the correct power to use under the Charter. There are many benefits to interpreting the law through rules rather than advisory opinions and this Bill seeks to reestablish that correct balance. As amended, Proposed Intro 735A would require the Conflicts of Interest Board to annual review the advisory opinions issued in the prior calendar year to see if any had interpretative value in construing the provisions of the Conflicts of Interest Law and either establish a standard or anticipate it to be subject of multiple future requests. The Board would then be required to initiate rule making to adopt any such opinion or part of an opinion. The Bill also requires the Board to review all the advisory opinions issued from 1990 to present for evaluation on the same criteria as I just mentioned and similarly to initiate rule making where relevant. This review is to be completed by May 1, 2020 but the Bill would not prohibit the

adoption of any rules on those subject after that		
date. Finally the Bill would require the inclusion		
of clarifying language and every advisory opinion		
explaining that just advisor opinion applies only to		
the public servant or public servant upon whose		
request it was issued. This language is merely a		
restatement of the scope of the advisory opinion		
power under existing law and the City Charter. I		
want to thank the members of this Committee for their		
support on this issue. I also want to thank the		
Conflicts of Interest Board for engaging on the		
details of this bill with us even when there were		
fundamental disagreements I believe the resulting		
Bill was improved by their discussions. I want to		
thank the staff who made this possible, Deputy		
General Council Serena Longly, Senior Legislative		
Council Brad Reed, Policy Analyst Elizabeth Crump,		
Rob Newman and our General Council Jason Atano (SP?)		
as well as my Chief of Staff David Carr. Do any		
members have any questions or comments? If with that		
being said, I will now ask our clerk Billy Martin to		
call the roll.
