My name is Jimmy Van Bramer, and I'm Chair of the committee, and we are now formally in session. Today we are holding a vote on five resolutions. They are Proposed Reso 203-A sponsored by Council Member Mathieu Eugene, a resolution establishing February 4th as Rosa Parks Day to commemorate the Civil Rights leader. We're also voting on Resolution No. 285 sponsored by Council Member Carlina Rivera calling upon the United States Secretary of the Interior to recognize the historical significance of Roberto Clemente's place of death in Loiza, Puerto Rico by adding it to the National Register of Historic Places. We're also voting on Resolution 420 sponsored by Council Member Bob Holden declaring November 11th as Polish Independence Day in the city of New York, Resolution 421 also sponsored by Council Member Bod Holden declaring October 11 as Casimir Pulaski Day in the city of New York, and finally Resolution 422, once again sponsored by Council Member Bob Holden
