CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: Alright, good morning everyone. Welcome to the Committee on Land Use. I am Council Member Rafael Salamanca, the Chair of this committee. I would like to welcome my esteemed colleagues who are members of the committee. Today we have Council Members Constantinides, Deutsch, King, Koo, Lancman, Reynoso, Richards, Torres, Grodenchik, Chair Adams, Diaz, Chair Moya, and Rivera and Council Member Gibson. I want to thank Chair Moya, Chair Adams and Chair Kallos for their work on our Land Use Subcommittees. Today, we will be voting on applications referred out of our three subcommittees. This morning we will vote approve LUs 250, 251 and 252, the St. Michael's Cemetery Park elimination and cemetery land acquisition applications for property a 72-02 Astoria Boulevard in Council Member Constantinides' district in Queens. These applications will facilitate the expansion of the existing cemetery. We will vote to approve for modifications LU 253, the Hebrew Home application for a special permit to allow a long-term care facility use in and R1-1 district in Council

2 Member Cohen's district in the Bronx. The Special Permit will facilitate a continuing care retirement 3 community including in total 388 independent living 4 5 dwelling units for seniors. Our modifications will 6 establish a designation buffer area ensuring that 7 only the proposed continuing care retirement community is built into R1-1 portion of the zoning 8 lot. I know Council Member Cohen has worked very 9 hard on this one. So, congratulations to him for all 10 of his work. We will also vote to approve LUs 254 an 11 12 authorization for the Speaker of the Council to execute the Second Amendment of the Coney Island 13 14 Special Process Agreement for proper in Council 15 Member Treyger's district in Brooklyn. 16 amendment is regarding the additional properties 17 locates adjacent to the Boardwalk, to the Coney 18 Island Amusement area. This property will eventually be mapped as a parkland. We will vote approve LUs 19 241, 242 and 243 related to property at 599 20 Courtlandt Avenue in my district in the Bronx. 21 2.2 approvals for disposition, acquisition, Urban 23 Development Action Area designation, and project approval will facilitate the construction of a new 4-24 25 story building with approximately eight affordable

COUNCIL MEMBER COHEN: Thank you, Chair.

I will be very brief. I just really want to thank

City Planning, the local advocates, the renown (sic)

Nature Conservancy, the Signal Place Neighborhood

ASSOCIACION, the hard work-the tremendous hard work
of the applicant Dan Reingold and the Hebrew Home and
his team. When this project started it was
incredibly controversial, and they really worked
very, very hard to address every single concern of
the community. This project is going to preserve a
tremendous amount of open space. Ninety percent of
the-of the campus—the south campus will be preserved
in open space. There's a-an MOU signed by the-the
Hebrew Home and the neighbors. So, really it's just
a tremendous amount of work to preserve the character
of the neighborhood and serve the needs of the Hebrew
Home. I just want to thank Jeff, Julie, Amy and
Roger for all of their hard work, hand-holding and
literally I don't know how many meetings to get us to
this place. So, I just wanted to say thank you and
thank you Chair, and I urge my colleagues to vote
aye. [laughs]

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: Thank you,
Council Member Cohen. Council Member King.

COUNCIL MEMBER KING: Good morning, Mr.

Chair and good morning committee. Thank you again

for your conversation and being there in support in

regards to this whole process of how to use 20-2550

2 Bartow Avenue as an animal care center. Over the last year, we've had a rough emotional conversation 3 with the neighborhood as well as animal rights 4 activists. It's been one of those times that trying to figure out how to make sure that service our 6 7 neighborhoods as well as provide-be in compliance with the law. A lot of the conversations -- and I'm 8 putting it on the record—a lot of the conversations 9 were not as cordial as they should have been. 10 shouldn't-they weren't as respectful as they should 11 12 have been. So, I say we in government are tasked 13 with the duty of being able to lead our neighborhoods, but it doesn't mean that we should 14 15 tolerate ugly and nasty conversations from advocates 16 because they're not getting-they think they're nor getting their way, and I put that on the record 17 18 because this disrespects all of us who work tirelessly in the city of New York to service our 19 20 residents and our constituents. And that all being said, when we started this conversation, this process 21 2.2 over three years ago, the conversation has changed. 23 The Community Board 10 voted to support an animal shelter, but not at this location at this time. 24 25 Borough President also came back with a

recommendation that this may not be the best site. At that point in time, I told my residents and on constituents that I will stand with them on whatever decision they want to make. During that time the conversation has changed that no only will animal shelters being offered at this location, but a number of community benefits agreements that will help improve the residents and co-ops' quality of life as well as the children as well as the seniors as well as traffic conditions as well as our development issues that have been stalled in the past. So, it's my responsibility to be able to educate the people of how the conversation has transitioned from day one to this fifth day that we're in right now. And sticking with my neighborhood, a number of residents have gone from an emphatic no saying we can live with the animal care center in the neighborhood providing that these agreements are fulfilled, which I'm very confident in the Speaker and the Mayor's Office and their fulfillment to making sure that everyone benefits not only just the animals, but the human beings who live each and every day in the co-ops of the area. So, with that all being said, I want to thank everyone for their patience, their help, and

for my colleagues. They're going to get a phone cal.
back from me. I just realized I was dealing with a
whole lot, trying to manage a whole lot to make sure
that they was more stable and—and not get—didn't get
too much out of hand. So, with that all being said,
I am supporting this project, and I'm asking my
colleagues to stand and support it with me as well as
we continue to serve the residents of the Bronx, and
all the animal lovers, our dog lovers, and I grew up
with a dog. So, I'm there with everyone as well.
So, with that being said, I'll be voting aye and ask
you all to join me on that, and thank you again, Mr.
Chair.

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: Congratulations, Sir-Council Member king. Any other comments or remarks from members of the committee? Alright, seeing none, I will now call a vote in accordance with recommendations of the Subcommittees and the local Council members to approve LUS 231, 241, 242, 243, 250, 251, 252 and 254, and to approve with the modifications I have described LUS 253.
