6 CHAIR DANIEL DROMM: (gavel pounding).

Good morning and welcome to today's Finance Committee Meeting. My name is Council Member Daniel Dromm and I am the Chair of the Committee. We have been joined by Council Member Robert Cornegy, Council Member James Van Bramer, Council Member Keith Powers, Council Member Adrienne Adams, Council Member Barry Grodenchik, Council Member Steve Matteo, Council Member Francisco Moya as well. Uhm today the Committee will be voting on seven items, one Transparency Resolution, one Pre-considered Resolution and five Article XI Property Tax Exemptions. First we have the Transparent Resolution which sets forth the new designation and changes in the designation of certain organizations receiving local Aging and Youth Discretionary Funding and Funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the Budget. Organizations appearing in the Resolution that have not yet completed the pre-qualification process conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contract

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2 Services, the Council or another entity are identified in the attached charts with an asterisk. 3 As with all Transparency Resolutions, Council Members 4 will have to sign a disclosure form indicating 5 whether or not a conflict exists with any of the 6 7 groups on the attached list. If any Council Member has a potential conflict of interest with any of the 8 organizations listed, he or she has the opportunity 9 to disclose the conflict at the time of their vote. 10 As a reminder, please disclose any conflicts that you 11 12 may have with proposed subcontractors used by 13 organizations sponsored by Discretionary Funding. 14 These disclosures must be made before the 15 subcontractor can be approved. Tomeka Pata (SP?) 16 from the General Counsel's Office is here and can assist you with any questions or concerns regarding 17 18 disclosures. Next, we have the Pre-considered Resolution sponsored by Speaker Johnson which would 19 20 ratify the Speaker's authorization to file a suit on behalf of the Council, challenging the City Planning 21 2.2 Commission's December 5, 2018 approvals of 23 modifications to the Special Permits granted for the Two Bridge Large Scale Residential Development. 24

These modifications which the CPC deemed minor, would

2 allow the construction of three skyscrapers on a single block that would triple the number of 3 residences in the Two Bridges area. Such 4 modifications are not minor and instead should have been submitted as requests for New Permits subjected 6 to the ULURP Public Review Process. Last, we have the Land Use items, the first is Turin House in 8 Council Member Rosenthal's District in Manhattan. 9 This Action would provide a Partial 30-year Article 10 XI Property Tax Exemption to support the preservation 11 12 of 189 units of Affordable Coop Housing. The second is 388 Richmond Terrance in Council Member Rose's 13 14 District in Staten Island. This Action would provide 15 a Partial 40-year Article XI Tax, Property Tax 16 Exemption to support the preservation of 122 units of 17 Affordable Housing. The third is West Farms in 18 Speaker, excuse me, in Council Member Salamanca's District in the Bronx. This Action would provide a 19 20 Partial 40-year Article XI Property Tax Exemption to support the preservation of 343 units of Affordable 21 2.2 Housing. The fourth is Langsam 15 in Council Member 23 Torres' District in the Bronx. The Action would provide a Partial 30-year Article XI Property Tax 24 Exemption to support the preservation of 60 units of 25
