6 CHAIR ADRIENNE ADAMS: Good afternoon, 7 welcome to this meeting of the Subcommittee on 8 Landmarks, Public Siting and Maritime Uses. I am 9 Council Member Adrienne Adams, the Chair of this 10 Subcommittee. We are joined today by Council Member 11 Koo and Matteo. Today we will be holding hearings 12 and voting on two school site selections, submitted 13 by the New York City School Construction Authority 14 pursuant to section 1732 of the Public Authorities 15 Law. The first hearing is on LU287 for the Site 16 Selection of a 432-seat primary school and a 231-seat 17 3KU/PKU facility at the former St. John Villa 18 Educational Campus in Community School District 31 in 19 Minority Leader Steve Matteo's District in Staten 20 Island. Our second hearing will be on LU288 for the 21 Site Selection of a new approximately 380-seat 2.2 Primary School Facility on the site of the Former St. 23 Rosalea Church located at block 5741 lot 5, Community 24 School District 20 in Council Member Menchaca's District in Brooklyn. I know open the Public Hearing 25

SUBCOMMITEE ON LANDMARKS, PUBLIC SITING AND MARITIME USES 4 1 2 on LU287 and recognize Minority Leader Matteo to speak on this application. 3 4 MINORITY LEADER STEVEN MATTEO: Thank you Chair Adams. I am here today to speak in support of 5 the proposed acquisition of the former St. John's 6 7 Villa Campus. For decades the Sisters of St. John the Baptist ably performed a mission of education for 8 Staten Island's Youth. Generations of students and 9 teachers walked the halls of this venerable 10 institution and many Staten Islanders received an 11 12 excellent education which enabled them to go on to high school, college and fulfilling careers. It is 13 for the reason as well as our desire to prevent 14 15 further overdevelopment of Staten Island that the 16 borough President I called to the City to acquire 17 this property as an educational campus. Continuing 18 to use the site for education not only provides much needed new classroom seats in the East Shore of 19 20 Staten Island but it also allows for the site to be used in a way with minimal impacts to their 21 2.2 surrounding neighborhood. Ultimately, that is what 23 is so important to get right about this eventual 24 project. The City is doing a great thing by maintaining the Villa Campus as a school site but we 25

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2 must make sure that we get all the details right, the kind of schools to be situated there, student 3 4 transportation, to a relationship with residential 5 neighbors and existing institution like the Galla House and all of the Land Use questions that arise 6 7 with any project like this, such as building utilizing and parking. Today's hearing only presents 8 us with a question of whether we approve the 9 acquisition of the site for schools. I have been 10 assured that all of the details are yet to be 11 12 finalized and that the New York City School Construction Authority is committed to working with 13 me and other stakeholders to ensure that a balanced 14 15 final project is made a reality for this campus. 16 That is why I am here today in supporting the purchase of this very important site and I will send 17 18 it back to you Chair Adams. Thank you. CHAIR ADRIENNE ADAMS: 19 Thank you very 20 much uhm Minority Leader. We have been joined by Council Member Menchaca. I now call upon the panel, 21

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Tami Rachelson, Ben Goodman, Gayle Mandaro, please step up. You are representing SCA of the School Construction Authority, before you begin, Counsel, will you please swear in the panel.

TAMI RACHELSON: Tami Rachelson. 4 5 GAYLE MANDARO: Gayle Mandaro. 6 COUNSEL: Do you affirm to tell the 7 truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth in your testimony before the subcommittee in response to 8 Council Member questions. 9 BEN GOODMAN: Yes. 10 TAMI RACHELSON: Yes. 11 12 GAYLE MANDARO: Yes. CHAIR ADRIENNE ADAMS: You may begin. 13 14 Thank you. 15 BEN GOODMAN: Thank you, good morning 16 Chair Person Adams and Council Members. My name is 17 Ben Goodman and I am a Community Relations Manager 18 for the School Construction Authority. Also, with me in Gayle Mandaro, Senior Director and Senior Attorney 19 20 for Real Estate Services and Tami Rachelson, Senior Manager for Project Operations in Real Estate. The 21 2.2 SCA has undertaken the site selection process for a 23 new 432-seat primary seat and 231-seat 3KU/PK facility on block 3087 lot 1 and 3089 lot 59 in the 24 25 borough of Staten Island. The site contains a total

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2 of approximately 313,632 square feet of lot area on the former St. John's Villa Academy Campus. The site 3 is privately owned, is located within the Staten 4 Island Community School District #2 and Community 5 School District #31. It is located within the 6 7 Arrochar neighborhood. Under the proposed project, the SCA plans to acquire the privately-owned property 8 and to renovate some of the existing buildings a 432-9 seat primary school and a 231-seat 3K/PKU facility. 10 The Notice of Filing for the Site Plan was published 11 12 in the New York Post, Staten Island Advance and the City Record on September 17, 2018. Staten Island 13 14 Community Board 2, Community Education Council 31 and 15 the City Planning Commission were all notified of the 16 Site Plan. CAC 31 held a hearing on September 17, 2018. Community Board 2 held a hearing on October 17 18 16th, 2018. The SCA has considered all comments received on the proposed site plan and a affirms the 19 20 site plan pursuant to section 1731 of the Public Authorities Law. In accordance with section 1732 of 21 2.2 the PAL, the SCA submitted the proposed site plan to 23 the Mayor and City Council by letter, dated December 7, 2018. We look forward to your subcommittee's 24 25 favorable consideration of the proposed site plan and

Thank you. 3 4 CHAIR ADRIENNE ADAMS: Thank you very 5 much for your testimony this morning. We want to note that uhm both of you spoke, at both applications 6 7 and that we will take care of LU287 first before 8 moving to LU288. Are there any more members or any members of the public that wish to testify on ... Oh, 9 10 sorry, Council Member Matteo question. STEVEN MATTEO: Thank you, thank you 11 12 Chair Adams, thank you all for being here today and for your constant cooperation with myself and my 13 14 office on all things SCA appreciated. I just had a 15 few questions, uhm just to go over. What kind of 16 capital work will be done in the outside ... to what 17 buildings? I believe you uhm ... 18 TAMI RACHELSON: Currently planning to uhm rehabilitate. Oh, we are currently planning to 19 20 rehabilitate the high school and the former elementary school uhm facilities for PS and the UPK 21 2.2 program at this time. 23 GAYLE MANDARO: And to use the gym 24 building on the campus as well. 25

You are tearing the whole things down? 4 5 You, you are existing, you are retro ... 6 TAMI RACHELSON: I believe the original 7 plan, though not designed yet in any kind of formal way is to try to rehab what we can at this time. 8 STEVEN MATTEO: Okay and the, what is the 9 plans for parking? Do we think we have sufficient? 10 TAMI RACHELSON: Being that it is a 7 and 11 12 approximately 7.2-acre campus we do believe there will be adequate parking. 13 14 STEVEN MATTEO: For the both, both 15 schools that we have. 16 TAMI RACHELSON: Correct. 17 STEVEN MATTEO: That we are talking 18 about. Okay, great. Uhm, listen, we have spoken a lot and you have spoken to my staff. You know where 19 20 I am, obviously I am supportive of us starting this process. We want the borough President and I want 21 2.2 SCA to take over this site as a school site. Uhm I 23 have spoken with the Department of Education as well, uh they have committed to working with us on a final 24 25 plan and hear our priorities and I just ask SCA do

SUBCOMMITEE ON LANDMARKS, PUBLIC SITING AND MARITIME USES 10 1 2 the same thing and work with the borough President and I as we move forward. 3 4 TAMI RACHELSON: We intent to work with all affected stakeholders as we move forward in the 5 6 design process. 7 STEVEN MATTEO: So, with that, uhm I send 8 it back to you uhm Chair Adams. CHAIR ADRIENNE ADAMS: Thank you very 9 much Council Member Matteo and now are there any 10 members of the public who wish to further comment on 11 12 this item? Seeing none. LU287 is now closed and I now open the public hearing on LU288 and recognize 13 14 Council Member Menchaca to speak on this application? 15 CARLOS MENCHACA: Thank you Chair and I 16 want to welcome the SCA back uhm I am not a member of 17 this Committee Chair uhm but it seems like I'm here 18 often and for really great reasons. I want to say thank you so much for the work that you have done on 19 20 the team, on the SCA team, uhm in partnership with all of the members of our, of our committee, uhm 21 2.2 Community and make space for quality schools, for 23 example, kind of brings to mind when I think about 24 the energy that is going on on the ground. Uhm this is an exciting moment for us in District 38 that 25

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2 encompasses a couple of highly overcrowded school Districts 20 and 15. Uhm currently we have about 30 3 4 public schools but students are yet still feeling 5 overcrowded and not getting the attention and the 6 support, uhm and support uhm but that is changing 7 with SCAs help, vision, focus, seven more schools are planned for the District and even more are in the 8 pipeline uhm including this one. Uhm these 7 planned 9 schools are bringing 3,000 more seats to the Council 10 District and I want to acknowledge that there has 11 12 been so much expertise and support and commitment of parents and you all working together, fighting with 13 14 our kids and our kids have been so vocal on the 15 ground too and I see them when they have taken over 16 SCA and taken over the City Council uhm already 17 prepared to take on these challenges uhm I also want 18 to make sure that I say uhm that well, while things are complicated on the ground, uhm what's never 19 20 complicated is our commitment to education so thank you so much uhm and I look forward to hearing your 21 2.2 testimony today. I have one question after your 23 testimony but thank you so much for being here and I 24 really urge the committee to support.

Council will swear in Tamar Smith SCA. 4 5 COUNSEL: Please state your name? 6 TAMAR SMITH: Tamar Smith. Thank you so 7 much Tamar Smith, School Construction Authority. COUNSEL: Do you affirm to tell the 8 truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth in 9 your testimony before this Committee and in response 10 to Council Member questions? 11 12 TAMAR SMITH: Yes, I do. CHAIR ADRIENNE ADAMS: Thank you very 13 14 much panel, you may begin. 15 TAMI RACHELSON: Good morning, Chair 16 Person Adams and Council Members, my name is Tami Rachelson and I am Senior Manager for Project 17 18 Operations in the New York City School Construction Authority Real Estate Department. Also, with me is 19 Gayle Mandaro, Senior Director and Senior Attorney 20 for Real Estate Services and Tamar Smith Community 21 2.2 Relations Manager. The SCA has undertaken the site 23 selection process for a new approximately 380-seat 24 primary school facility on block 5741 lot 5 in the 25 Borough of Brooklyn. Site contains a total of

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2 approximately 920,000 square feet of lot area on the former St. Rosalea Church Property. The site is 3 privately owned but improved and is located within 4 Brooklyn Community District #11 and Community School 5 District #20. It is located in the neighborhood of 6 7 Bensonhurst and under the proposed project the SCA would acquire the property and construct a new 8 approximately 300-seat primary facility. The Notice 9 of Site Planning was published in the New York Post 10 and City Record on October 10, 2018 at which time 11 12 Community Education Counsel #20, Brooklyn Community Board #11 and the City Planning Commission were also 13 notified of the Site Plan. On October 10th, the CEC 14 15 and Community Board were asked to hold public 16 hearings on the proposed site plan, Community Board #11 held a public hearing on November 7th and 17 18 submitted comments, CEC 20 held a public hearing on November 8th. Written comments were not received 19 from the CEC nor from the City Planning Commission. 20 The SCA has considered all comments received on the 21 2.2 proposed site plan and affirms the site plan pursuant 23 through Section 1731 of the Public Authorities Law in accordance with section 1732 of the PAL. The SCA 24 25 submitted the proposed site plan to the Mayor and

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City Council by letter dated December 7, 2018. We
look forward to your Subcommittee's favorable
consideration of the proposed site plan and are
prepared to answer questions from the Committee.
Thank you.

7 CHAIR ADRIENNE ADAMS: Thank you very 8 much for your testimony. Council Member Menchaca 9 questions?

10 CARLOS MENCHACA: Yes, thank you chair. 11 Uhm the Diesis has been a really great partner uhm on 12 many sites. Can you tell us a little bit about how 13 this Site became uhm a possible Site? Was a 14 communication from Diesis? Did you, kind of 15 affirmatively ask the Diesis for the Site? How did 16 that, how did that start?

17 TAMI RACHELSON: Well, we have very close 18 relationship with the Diesis. We have about 60 leases with them, they are our largest landlord and 19 20 we are their largest tenant and we work very closely. We are in daily contact with them and uh they sort of 21 2.2 have their finger on the pulse of our needs and sort 23 of have a finger on the pulse of unfortunately their schools are and properties that they may no longer. 24 25 So, uhm they know that District 20 has always been an

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area of high need and they came to us and said that this property had been basically vacant for years because of the two pari... the two nearby parishes had merged and they said would be interested and we took it from there.

7 CARLOS MENCHACA: Thank you for that and uhm you know I was talking off-line with Council 8 Member Matteo about his Site and we were both, uhm 9 10 comparing notes in some ways and these, these projects, kind of conversations from the Diesis to 11 12 public schools often have some challenges. Do you, did you see any challenges has you approach the 13 14 building? The is…

TAMI RACHELSON: Okay this is, I, I just
want, sorry I was not clear. This is vacant land.
It had not been on.

CARLOS MENCHACA: No and I, I understand that but just more on the site itself, where it is located. Any challenges that you can kind of forsee uhm in just kind of transparency and there might be any but I think this is where I want to be, to be clear.

24 TAMI RACHELSON: We had done a test fit 25 uhm to see and we could fit 380-seat school uhm

We, full disclosure, we will need to do a zoning override. 3 4 CARLOS MENCHACA: Uh-huh, uh-huh. 5 TAMI RACHELSON: Because it's in an M1 and we are also exceeding certain you know on both. 6 7 CARLOS MENCHACA: Right. 8 TAMI RACHELSON: But other than that, we don't forsee any problems. 9 CARLOS MENCHACA: Good and like I said 10 you have my full support and we will be back for all 11 12 of those approvals in and it is just like good to make sure that every site is very different. 13 The 14 communities are different uhm and we don't want to 15 feel like there is one solution and that in fact what 16 we saw here was a real opportunity and uhm to address the overcrowded issue with community in-hand and 17 18 support with kind of full, full throttle support, especially from me. Okay I think that is it for me 19 20 on questions. Thank you so much. CHAIR ADRIENNE ADAMS: Thank you very 21 2.2 much Council Member. Thank you, panel, I just want 23 to say, from, from, just a personal note here it is 24 always heartwarming for me to see schools go up, go 25 up in our City. It is tremendous to see these

We still have trailers on some 4 5 locations, in our District and I just you know 6 commend you for your thoughtfulness and placement uhm 7 for these facilities and uhm we, we need to see more 8 as you know. So, thank you very much for your testimony this afternoon. 9 10 TAMI RACHELSON: Thank you. TAMAR SMITH: Thank you. 11 12 CHAIR ADRIENNE ADAMS: Are there any more members of the public who wish to testify on these 13 14 items? Okay, seeing none. The public hearing on 15 LU288 is now closed. Uhm we will go into recess 16 briefly, we need a quorum to vote. (silence). Okay 17 in accordance with the affected members recommendations, we will now vote on both items. 18 We will vote to approve LU287 for a Site Selection of a 19 20 432-seat primary school and a 231-seat K3/UPK Facility at the former St. John Villa Educational 21 2.2 Campus in Staten Island. We will also vote to 23 approve LU288 the Site Selection for a new 24 approximately 380-seat primary school facility on the 25

Counsel. 4 COUNSEL: Adams? 5 CHAIR ADRIENNE ADAMS: I vote aye. 6 COUNSEL: Koo? 7 PETER KOO: Aye. 8 COUNSEL: Treyger? MARK TREYGER: Uhm with congratulations 9 with my colleague Council Member Menchaca who is 10 helping address a crisis and in terms for the need 11 for additional seats in District 20 which is one of 12 13 the most overcrowded Districts in the New York City 14 School System. I vote aye. 15 COUNSEL: With a vote of three in the 16 affirmative, zero in the negative and zero 17 abstentions. The items are recommended for approval 18 by the full Land Use Committee and the vote is held 19 open. 20 CHAIR ADRIENNE ADAMS: Thank you very much, we will hold the vote open for 10 minutes. 21 2.2 This concludes today's business. I would like to 23 thank the members of the public, my colleagues, 24 Council and the great Land Use Staff for attending 25
