I urge my colleagues on the committee to vote in favor of this legislation, and among the people today that we will be honoring Angelo Falcone, Gertrude McDonald, who I knew personally and was a member of Community Board 2 in Queens for many years. Christopher Wallace also known as Biggie Smalls, and

Nepali Community in the Borough of Queens. Any of my

COUNCIL MEMBER KING: Thank you, Mr. Chair and I'll be really brief, but I just want to congratulate these names that have been submitted and with the goal of offering remembrance to those who've worked hard for us and the city of New York such a Gerry Ram, who was a great NYCHA TA leader, and who has done so much, and I appreciate the time that I had to sit with her as she did what she had to do for us in the boogie down Bronx and beyond. And as we offer up this booklet of names [laughs] to shriek your name across the city of New York while we continue to remember. I ask us to also be responsible and responsive, too, as we continue to street rename that we don't oversaturate ourselves as well when we change our-some of the history of the city of New York by our street renamings. So, that is what we said to all the pastors, all the
