SUBCOMMITTEE ON LANDMARKS, PUBLIC SITING AND MARITIME USES 3 1 2 [sound check] [pause] [gavel 3 CHAIRPERSON ADAMS: Good afternoon, and 4 welcome to this meeting of the Subcommittee on 5 Landmarks, Public Siting and Maritime Uses. I'm 6 Council Member Adrienne Adams, the Chair of this 7 Subcommittee. Today, we are joined by Council Member 8 Koo and are expecting our other members to join 9 shortly. Today, we will be holding a public hearing 10 on a school site selection submitted by the New York 11 City School Construction Authority pursuant to 12 Section 1732 of the Public Authorities Law. We will 13 also be voting on this application. This 14 Preconsidered LU is an application for the site 15 selection of the new approximately 676-seat primary 16 school facility on property located on the eastern end of the block bounded by 63rd Street to the north, 17 64<sup>th</sup> Street to the south, 13<sup>th</sup> Avenue to the east and 18 19 12<sup>th</sup> to the west in Community School District No. 20, 20 Community District 10 in Council Member Menchaca's 21 district in Brooklyn [coughs] I now open the public 22 hearing on this item, and will read Council Member 23 Menchaca's statement. Good afternoon, I'd like to 24 start by thanking Chair Adams for her willingness to 25 deliver these comments and questions on my behalf.

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2 I'd also like to extend my deep gratitude to the School Construction Authority who has been doing the 3 critical work of finding sites and building new 4 5 schools in the neighborhoods I represent. Many of the schools in District 20 are overcrowded, and I'm 6 7 excited that another primary school is on the way to improve the access and quality of schools for our 8 I fully support this application and encourage 9 kids. 10 the committee to vote yes. I do, however, want to reflect some concerns brought to my attention by the 11 12 local community board. I'm hoping SCA can provide answers to these questions either today, during the 13 14 hearing or in writing in the near future. Regarding 15 bus congestion. Is SCA aware of traffic concerns 16 from neighbors of the site in question particularly 17 overnight bus parking near existing schools? Does 18 SCA consider these traffic concerns significant? Does SCA plan to evaluate the unique school bus 19 20 congestion that neighbors claim is already negatively impacting the neighborhood? (2) Regarding a 21 2.2 potential driveway, is SCA open to Community Board 23 10's request that the school design include a driveway to alleviate congestion during school drop-24 25 off and pickup times? And by extension, is SCA

(3) the proposed 3 4 school sits on-on a site adjacent to the historic 5 Angel Guardian Home. Many residents Dyker Heights consider this architectural-consider this an 6 7 architectural gem in the neighborhood and are requesting that the new school be designed with 8 respect to this historic character. Does SCA plan to 9 10 consider a contextual design for this proposed school? Is SCA willing to engage with Community 11 12 Board 20 periodically during the school design process to elicit feedback and (4) does SCA plan to 13 14 include open space as part of the design for this 15 school? Thank you and thank you all for your work to 16 improve access to quality public schools across New York City. Sincerely, Council Member Carlos 17 18 Menchaca. 9	CHAIRPERSON ADAMS: You may begin.
10	GAYLE MANDARO: Good afternoon,
11	Chairperson Adams, Counsel and Council Members. My
12	name is Gayle Mandaro, and I am a Senior Director and
13	Senior Attorney for the Real Estate Services Group in
14	the New York City School Construction Authority's
15	Real Estate Department. Also with me is my colleague
16	Tamara Smith, a Community Relations Manager for the
17	SCA. The New York City School Construction Authority
18	has undertaken the site selection process for a new
19	approximately 576-seat primary school facility on
20	Block 5739 portion of a lot 1 in the Borough of
21	Brooklyn. The site contains a total of approximately
22	24,000 square feet of lot area on a portion of the
23	former Angel Guardian Home property. The site is
24	privately owned and comprised of gardens, lawn areas,
25	paved walkways and trees, which served as the

District No. 10, and Community School District No. 4 It is located in the neighborhood of Dyker 5 20. 6 Heights. Under the proposed project, the SCA would 7 acquire the site and construct a new approximately 676-seat primary school facility. The notice of 8 filing for the site plan was published in the New 9 York Post and city record on December 10, 2018 at 10 which time Community Education Council No. 20, 11 12 Brooklyn Community Board No. 10 and the City Planning 13 Commission were also notified of the site plan. The 14 CEC and the and Community Board were asked to hold 15 public hearings on the proposed site plan. Brooklyn 16 Community Board No. 10 held a public hearing on December 11, 2018, and submitted written comments. 17 18 Community Education Council No. 20 held a public hearing on December 12, 2018. Written comments were 19 not received from the Community Education Council or 20 the City Planning Commission. The SCA has 21 2.2 considered all comments received on the proposed site 23 plan, and affirms the site plan pursuant to Section 1731 of the New York Public Authorities Law. I 24 accordance with Section 1732, of the PAL, the SCA 25

SUBCOMMITTEE ON LANDMARKS, PUBLIC SITING AND 1 MARITIME USES 8 2 submitted the proposed site plan to the Mayor and City Council by a letter dated January 28, 2019. 3 We 4 look forward to your Subcommittee's favorable consideration of the proposed site plan and are 5 6 prepared to answer any questions the committee may 7 have. 8 CHAIRPERSON ADAMS: Thank you. Before you go on, we have been joined by Council Members 9 10 Treyger and Miller. Please continue. GAYLE MANDARO: We will take any 11 12 questions that the committee may have at this time. 13 CHAIRPERSON ADAMS: The only questions 14 that I have are the ones that were brought by the 15 statement by Council Member Menchaca. Can you 16 address any of those questions? Do you remember 17 them? Do you need for me to restate them? 18 GAYLE MANDARO: No, I'm going to defer to my colleague Tamara Smith who will address those 19 20 questions. 21 CHAIRPERSON ADAMS: Okay, thank you. 2.2 TAMARA SMITH: Thank you very much. Ι 23 want to thank Council Member Menchaca for his 24 support. [bell] It's very important to us. We will be happy to carefully consider the questions that he 25

SUBCOMMITTEE ON LANDMARKS, PUBLIC SITING AND 1 MARITIME USES 9 2 brought to our attention and will answer them in writing very soon. 3 CHAIRPERSON ADAMS: Okay, so, let me just 4 5 make sure that there are no questions that can be 6 answered right now today. You're going to-you're 7 going to address them all separately at another time for him? 8 TAMARA SMITH: Actually, we can provide 9 10 some insights to some of the things. While we have not commenced design yet, we are committee to take 11 12 into consideration the proposed suggestions for driveways and bus parking issues, and if they work 13 14 within the programmatic we certainly would take them 15 into consideration. We will at some point in our 16 pre-schematic stage consider those design 17 recommendations. In addition, the site itself and 18 the subdivision that's planned for the site does 19 contemplate open space. So, yes, we will be having 20 open space, and yes, we will be happy to update the community board and engage them through the process. 21 2.2 CHAIRPERSON ADAMS: Thank you very much. 23 Thank you. Are there any questions from the panel at 24 this time? Council Member Treyger.

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SUBCOMMITTEE ON LANDMARKS, PUBLIC SITING AND 1 MARITIME USES 10 2 COUNCIL MEMBER TREYGER: Thank you very 3 much, Chair, for-for this important hearing, and as Chair of Education in the City Council, I have 4 somewhat of a voice from these neck of the woods, and 5 very much aware of the overcrowding really crisis 6 7 that District 20 faces. This is a very much needed school construction project. This is not even about 8 getting a wish list together. This is about a 9 necessity for the city of New York. It's my 10 understanding that there are over-the need for seats 11 12 in District 20 exceeds over 10,000, and can you just repeat for the record-this is an elementary school. 13 14 Is that correct? 15 TAMARA SMITH: Correct. 16 COUNCIL MEMBER TREYGER? And how many 17 seats? 18 TAMARA SMITH: We're anticipating approximately 676 elementary school seats. 19 20 COUNCIL MEMBER TREYGER? And this is just one lot that is a part of this whole site? Is that 21 2.2 correct? 23 TAMARA SMITH: It is presently one lot. It's being subdivided as I understand it into three. 24 One will be the school lot. 25

TAMARA SMITH: I do not know what the 4 5 private owner is planning for, but I do know that he has been engaged with the community on his project as 6 7 well. 8 COUNCIL MEMBER TREYGER: But have you heard anything about a potential charter school being 9 built right next to this public school? 10 11 TAMARA SMITH: Actually, we've received 12 no confirmation of that at all. I know that at one point it may have been raised, but I do not know any 13 further information probably than anyone else in the 14 15 community. 16 COUNCIL MEMBER TREYGER: Because the 17 reason why I asked is because in District 20 there's 18 also a middle school seating crisis. There's a need for more middle schools in that district. 19 Is-are 20 there any discussions or plans to maybe acquire more space in addition to the lot to address that need? 21 2.2 TAMARA SMITH: The SCA has acquired the 23 space that was made available for purchase. COUNCIL MEMBER TREYGER: And are there 24 other sites available for purchase? 25

SUBCOMMITTEE ON LANDMARKS, PUBLIC SITING AND 1 MARITIME USES 12 2 TAMARA SMITH: Throughout Brooklyn? 3 COUNCIL MEMBER TREYGER: No, in that 4 same--5 TAMARA SMITH: [interposing] In that 6 development? 7 COUNCIL MEMBER TREYGER: Right. TAMARA SMITH: Not to my knowledge. 8 COUNCIL MEMBER TREYGER: Alright. I-I 9 10 just-I-I mean I-I and I respect--I think my colleague is in support of the project, if that's-that's 11 12 correct Council Member Menchanca. I just want to stress that that this is beyond just a wish. This is 13 needed, beyond needed, and I would just strongly urge 14 15 and support any additional efforts to try to acquire 16 more space in that vicinity to address a 10,000-seat 17 need. That's how serious this is. So, again, I want 18 to thank the Chair for this important hearing, and I definitely want to offer my strong support. Thank 19 20 you. CHAIRPERSON ADAMS: Thank you, Council 21 2.2 Member Treyger. I will echo your comments and 23 sentiments as well. Whenever we see SCA building in our communities, we have to stress, and I'm sure 24 we're preaching to the Choir again how important this 25

SUBCOMMITTEE ON LANDMARKS, PUBLIC SITING AND 1 MARITIME USES 13 2 is that we look across the city because as representatives of Queens, Council Member Miller and 3 4 myself, you already know the need is very, very, very 5 substantial as well. So, I thank you very much for 6 your time and your testimony today. 7 TAMARA SMITH: Thank you very much, Chair. 8 CHAIRPERSON ADAMS: Thank you. Are there 9 10 any more members of the public who wish to testify on these items? Seeing, none, the public hearing on 11 12 this Preconsidered LU is now closed. In accordance 13 with the affected Council Member's recommendations we 14 will now vote on this item. We will vote to approve 15 this Preconsidered LU non-ULURP application No. 16 209531 SCK for site selection of approximately 676-17 seat primary school facility in Community School 18 District 20 in Brooklyn. Counsel, please call the roll. 19 20 LEGAL COUNSEL: Adams. COUNCIL MEMBER ADAMS: I vote aye. 21 2.2 LEGAL COUNSEL: Koo. 23 COUNCIL MEMBER KOO: I vote aye. 24 LEGAL COUNSEL: Miller. 25 COUNCIL MEMBER MILLER: Aye.

Thank you. 8 9 [pause] 10 LEGAL COUNSEL: On Preconsidered LU-Non-ULURP Application No. 2095311, how do vote, Council 11 Member Barron? 12 13 COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: I vote aye, and 14 thank you for holding the vote open. 15 CHAIRPERSON ADAMS: You're very welcome. LEGAL COUNSEL: With 5 in the 16 17 affirmative, 0 in the negative and 0 abstentions, the 18 item is recommended for consideration by the full Land Use Committee. 19 20 CHAIRPERSON ADAMS: And that concludes 21 today's business. I'd like to thank the members of 2.2 the public, my colleagues, Counsel and Land Use staff for attending today's hearing. This meeting is 23 hereby adjourned. [gavel] 24 25
